

Your Mountain is Designed to take you to the Next Level

Joshua 6:1-4/14-15



The walls of Jericho, **massive stone walls surrounding an ancient Neolithic settlement in Jericho**, were built about 8000 BC. These walls were at least 13 feet (4 meters) in height and backed by a watchtower or redoubt some 28 feet tall.

This week we want to discuss the mountains in our lives and their significance.

Mountains are mentioned frequently in the bible because they dotted the landscape where the stories in the bible took place. Not only does scripture use them physically, but scriptures also use mountains in a symbolic and prophetic sense. We want to look at four mountains in the bible.

Mount Sinai 7,497F Moses receives the Ten Commandments here, symbolizing God's covenant with Israel (Exodus 19:1-12). God is reminding us he is with us.

Mount Transfiguration (Mount Tabor) 1,886 ft before the disciple's eyes Jesus is transfigured, appearing as he will after the resurrection, next to Moses and Elijah (Matthew 17: 1-9). God proclaims his oneness.

Mount Carmel 1,724 ft Elijah calls God to light a sacrifice on fire, proving to the prophets of Baal that he is one true God. God is with you, although the odds are against you.

Mount of Temptation (where Jesus was tempted by the Devil (Luke 4:1-13). Your temptation is for your growth. (James 1:1-3)).
