

As I think about this year with its imperfections along with my own, these are valuable words from Section 2 of Pope Frances' Letter on the Year of St. Joseph, "Patris Corde: "With a Father's Heart".

St. Joseph, Model of Faith in Difficulty – In Pope Frances' Letter on the Year of St. Joseph, Patris Corde: "The Heart of the Father" we read these encouraging words: "Even through Joseph's fears, God's will, his history and his plan were at work. Joseph, then, teaches us that faith in God includes believing that he can work even through our fears, our frailties and our weaknesses. He also teaches us that amid the tempests of life, we must never be afraid to let the Lord steer our course. At times, we want to be in complete control, yet God always sees the bigger picture." With the end of the school year, these words are relevant. This year we endured "tempests" and encountered our own "frailties and weaknesses." Yet, through these, beautiful things also happened, reminding us of God's plan. For example, last Tuesday St. John's had our spring concert outdoors "on the green." It was a beautiful gathering of families. The young ones sang a song comparing each flower "singing to God" as analogous to each of us made uniquely in the image of God having the ability to sing praise to God with our lives. Another song, gave permission to join in with each other in smiling. At the end was a climax of ukuleles. Since singing was curtailed in school this year, Mrs. Furasek had the brilliant idea of the 5th and 6th grade learning ukuleles. Our ukuleles arrived in January with the goal of them accompanying "Somewhere over the rainbow" the de facto ukulele theme song. They did beautifully! And then the climax was the Hallelujah song put to alternative Resurrection lyrics! Wow! The gathering was beautiful, the faith-filled songs gave that sense that always seems to accompany the Christmas and Spring concerts that "This was all worth it!" and "This is what it's all about!" Once again, despite our imperfections and weakness, God's beauty shone. Especially in light of the cross of the sacrifices made this school year, the beauty of Faith wins out that was won by Jesus' death and resurrection.
