Sadly, we have needed to close our church building again, so....

This Sunday for the first time we are going to hold our morning service on

"Zoom". This will be our annual (Methodist) Covenant Service. Joining details are below, with instructions for first time users. The words for the service are attached and can be printed out if you wish.

FOR First Time Zoom Users:

If you have never joined a Zoom Meeting before - and you have received this email – it is very likely that you can join by clicking the link below.

(But please only join if your device - phone, computer or tablet – has a speaker, or you won't be able to hear the service)

For people to be able to see you your device (phone, computer, tablet) will need a camera (and you will need to click or tap the "camera" icon).

For people to be able to hear you your device (phone, computer, tablet) will need a microphone (and you will need to click or tap the "microphone" icon).

If this is the first time you are using Zoom you can practice before the service – if you click on the link and follow instructions you should get to a screen which says "The Host knows you are waiting and will let you in soon". If you are just practicing leave/close the meeting at this stage, and you will know you can get to the service on Sunday...

CHURCH CLOSURE

As you know, our Church has decided to close for worship for the moment. Please read the attached statements from representatives of the Methodist Church and the URC which support the decision which has been made. God Bless and stay safe. Peter

Guidance from the URC Synod Moderators on closing church buildings for public worship.

Since our last guidance was issued (October 2020), it is clear that the new variant of the virus has caused a rapid and alarming increase in Coronavirus infections.

In light of this, the Synod Moderators strongly recommend that churches should cease to meet for in-person worship and move exclusively to on-line or paper-based worship material.

exclusively to on-line or paper-based worship material. You are reminded that the URC, through the Daily Devotions team, continue to produce Sunday services which can be listened to online and followed on paper, in addition to any local worship provision. Whilst it is vital (literally, life-giving) to maintain our habits of worship, this cannot depend on meeting in a church building.

The Synod Moderators remind the United Reformed Church of our previous advice: because something is allowed does not necessarily make it wise; it is better to do the right thing. In The Message, Micah 6:8 is rendered in this way:

"But he's already made it plain how to live, what to do, what God is looking for in men and women. It's quite simple: Do what is fair and just to your neighbour, be compassionate and loyal in your love".

No church wishes its building to be the site of a spreading event, which puts lives at risk. Consequently, our advice is now that even when permitted in law during a time of National Lockdown and at the appropriate level 4 of restrictions, our churches should close for public worship.

Weddings/Civil Partnerships and Funerals may continue, subject to legislative restrictions. This recommendation also permits the minimum number reasonably possible to meet in the church building to allow recording/broadcasting by internet or telephone an act of worship, provided that they continue to follow the regulations to maintain a Covid-secure building and as long as it doesn't conflict with any legal restrictions against this when the law takes precedence over our advice.

If, despite this advice, an Elders' Meeting (or equivalent) decides that they should continue to offer in-person worship within the relevant legislation, they must review their Risk Assessment and rigorously apply it in order to maximise the protection afforded to those who will attend. A failure to do this may result in a breach of Health & Safety law. The Elders will need to record their decision and the reasons that lead them to that decision. They may well find that Ministers, Lay Preachers and others are not willing to lead worship in-person while the risk of infection is high, and the Elders must be ready to make alternative arrangements.

The refusal to lead in-person worship because of the risk to a Minister and others would not be considered a disciplinary issue by any Synod Moderator.

We also want to remind you that the work of the church will not cease even if we are not meeting for in-person worship. We encourage all churches to think about how to care for their community, and support people who may be dealing with mental health issues or facing domestic abuse, whilst minimising the risk of spreading Coronavirus. This period is also a missional opportunity.

We rejoice at the speed of development and deployment of the Covid vaccines. We pray that our current situation will be temporary although we cannot know for how much longer we will have to be very cautious. We believe that we will end 2021 in a much stronger place than we entered into this new year. Until that point, we urge churches to continue to show love to one another and treat others gently.

CHRISTMAS GIFT DONATIONS

Many, many thanks for your generous and caring donations towards our centres nominated for gifts during the Christmas season this year. As we could not hold our usual Gift Service, we asked for financial donations and are delighted to say in total we received £695.00. This total includes donations handed to me separately after the deadline for gifts to be given to our treasurer. With this amazing amount we have been able to send:

£100 to Action for Children for their appeal to buy new pyjamas for children to wear on Christmas Eve. The local centre we support works from Ellergreen Community Centre in Norris Green. £100 each was given to Centre 56 who provide Nursery and After School care for children in the Kirkdale area of Liverpool who are in home situations suffering from domestic and financial abuse. Two Refuge centres, one in the North of the City and one close to us in the South. These centres offer refuge to women and children fleeing from domestic abuse. The money was used to provide presents for the children in the centres at Christmas time.

£295 was given to The Whitechapel Centre who provide and support families in distress at the Belvidere Centre. There were 50 children in the centre over the Christmas period who will have benefitted from your help. We have received a letter of thanks from the Whitechapel centre thanking us for our help and support.

Thank you once again for your generosity and kindness which helped all these centres provide toys, toiletries, sweets! and many other goodies to the children in need. Wendy Doig.

I surrender to You all my hurt, pain, worry, doubt, fear, and anxiety, and I ask You to wash me clean.




I release everything into Your compassionate care.


