### One of Pastor Tom's messages for HM3

HM3 MESSAGE - Read Matthew 14: 13-21

I grew up in southwestern Indiana, a place of immense farms and coal mines. My mother's family were coal miners back in the day of shaft-mines, when the coal was taken out by hand. My maternal grandmother – "Granny" as she was called, was quite the cook! In 1929, the United States stock market crashed, which contributed to an economic depression – Many people were out of work, and the economy did not begin to recover until many years later. Lots of folks had no place to live, or sleep, and food was as scarce as hen's teeth. My Granny always provided food and drink to those who showed up at her door – Soon, word spread among the needy that they could stop at my Granny's to be fed on her front porch – My Granny lived out the message, "Bring the hungry to me, and I will feed them!" Granny's story reminds me of the Bible story of Jesus feeding the five thousand – Jesus fed the people who came to hear his message by turning five loaves of bread and two fish into enough food for everyone. While my Granny couldn't multiply her food, she knew she could help feed the hungry, and she did so in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ! Would you pray with me please – Thank you Lord, for people who care for others in your name – Help us to act when we see opportunities to serve others......Amen!





Chilighetti Recipe-1 1/2 pounds ground beef, 1 big onion, chopped, Chili powder, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 3 teaspoons salt. 1/2 teaspoon pepper. 1 can kidney beans. 1 1/2 cups broken uncooked spaghetti, 2 cups tomato juice. Brown ground beef and onion and add seasonings. In oiled casserole alternate layers of beef, beans and uncooked spaghetti, beginning and ending with beef. Grow Mushrooms-35 percent version, a few drops to fruiting chambers. Clean the Dishwasher. spray hydrogen peroxide directly into the appliance, let sit a bit, then wipe out. Whiten Almost Anything for the nails one part hydrogen peroxide with two parts bak-	

ing soda and rub the paste on your nails. two or three minutes, then rinse away. whitening grout, either pour the hydrogen peroxide straight on to the tile or make a paste with baking soda and scrub away. Make a Mouthwash. dilute first (half water, half hydrogen peroxide), then swish in your mouth for one minute and spit out. Never swallow! Boost Your a cup of hydrogen peroxide to your washing machine. Kill Mold and Mildew-a spray bottle of hydrogen and spray your bathroom fixtures, floors, walls, humidifier, dehumidifier, even your shower curtain. Grow Your Garden-pest control or growth, add one teaspoon to one cup of water in a spray bottle and mist the plant. To combat root rot or fungal infections, use one tablespoon per cup of water. Keep Food Fresher-Spraying salad greens and fruits and veggies spritzed or bathed in a hydrogen peroxide solution to keep them fresher longer. rinse them thoroughly.
