1994 LSPNG and SPCM Conference

This joint conference was hosted by the University of Technology at Lae PNG on June 24-25. The conference theme was *Communication within a Multilingual Environment*. It was attended mostly by individuals living in PNG, however Hong Kong and New Zealand were also represented. There were a good number of interesting papers presented including the following titles:

Issues in the phonology of Kafe.

Domain dependent code choices in the Musom language and their implications for the future of the Musom language.

Patterned Oral Paraphrase: A simplified model for village based translation in PNG.

Three case studies showing resistance to language shift from the vernacular toward Tok Pisin or Police Motu in PNG.

Tok Pisin and Cantonese - Why the similarity?

Melanesian Languages: Do they have a future?

Orthographic symbols in Papua New Guinea languages.

1995 LSPNG Annual Conference

The Summer Institute of Linguistics will host our 1995 conference at Ukarumpa during the end of June or early July dependent on the timing of the PNG school break. The exact dates and venue are still to be agreed upon. Information on the details will be in the next Hebou.

1994 Annual General Meeting

Our annual General Meeting was held at the end of the conference on June 25th.

The last year's AGM suggested that the 1996 Papuan focus should be held in Indonesia. This year's AGM again supported that suggestion. The Executive committee will pursue the matter.

There was a report on UPNG's efforts to form a Language Institute. The focus of the Institute would be to provide assistance to people asking for help in language related matters, or to direct people toward other agencies capable of providing such assistance. It may also serve as a central

archive of language research materials. The proposal is now before the Vice Chancellor. The LSPNG will formally endorse this proposal.

It was decided that LSPNG would endorse an association for the study of pidgins and Creoles in the Pacific region. This association might either complement or replace local pidgin and Creole societies.

The following officers were elected for 1995: President - Apoi Yarapea, President Elect - Elias Kawas, Secretary/Treasurer - Daryl Pfantz, Editor for LLM - John Clifton, Review Editor for LLM - Ana Kila, Members at Large - Simon Sengai, John Hamau.

Scholarships

The Society gave two prizes of K50 to two linguistics students who received the highest marks at UPNG for this past year. We also awarded K400 each to four UPNG Honors students currently doing field work. They will be reporting on their work to the Society.
