COL Micki King US Air Force

COL Maxine "Micki" King, Fayette Co., joined the air force in 1966, ultimately becoming a faculty member of the Air Force Academy and the first female to coach a male athlete to a NCAA championship. She was also first female Commander of an Air Force ROTC detachment at the University of Kentucky. She retired in 1992, after nearly 26 years of military service.

While Micki was in the military, she competed in the 1968 and 1972 Olympic Games, earning 10 national diving titles and capturing a gold medal in 1972 for springboard diving in Munich, along with competing in two Pan American Games. Micki was instrumental in supporting Title IX in 1972, ushering in equality in education programs based on gender and led the way for women to be admitted to US military academies. She joined Billie Jean King and others to found the Women's Sports Foundation and served on President Gerald Ford's "Commission to Study Olympic Sports". Micki has been part of the US Olympic staff for eight Olympiads. She has set the bar for female leadership, breaking the glass ceiling in several areas and striving for change. She serves on the executive board of the World Fit Foundation, mentoring children about lifelong fitness, perseverance, respect and fair play.
