From the Kazim Central Virginia Clowns

WOW—yesterday was Valentine’s Day. So, that reminds me of an old saying, “A nose is a nose”. Wait, that must be a clown’s version of some famous saying. But let’s think about that. Is it true that a nose is just a nose? Not to a clown. A clown’s nose is a very integral part of the persona. Sure you can use any nose you want, but if you want to see how many choices there are for a nose got to Leon McBride’s website, www.proknows.com. In case you do not know, Leon is a retired clown from Ringling Brothers. When he retired he was Boss clown. So he knows a nose! We, in central Virginia are fortunate to have him living in Buchanan, Va. At our circus about 2 weeks ago one of the K Klowns from Kazim called Leon and he came over to sell a few noses and accessories and answer our thousand questions about makeup. I had 2 noses I had purchased from his website which just did not fit right. He got his Dremel out and in a few minutes I had 2 perfect fits. Not only that but he told us how they should fit. I am a Hobo clown, but I wanted a red nose to wear sometimes. He had plenty red noses with him but would not sell me one because they were all glossy and he said Hobos do not wear glossy noses. Of course he was right. He told me he had some at home and told me what to order. As a Hobo I use a white mouth. For the last 7 + years that I have clowned I have fought some of the the white coming off my mouth as I clown. I have asked several clowns if there is any makeup to help and had not found a solution. Of course Leon had the solution. For your info it is called LipChic by Ella. It is a sealer that you put on after setting the white with powder. I have not tried it yet but have no doubt it will work. He did say it makes your mouth tingle for a while. If interested, you can get it from Proknows. My point, though, is that your nose is an important part of your makeup so be sure it complements your

complete look. I do not mean it has to be a purchased nose because some clowns can paint their nose on and it looks great. But I do not agree that “a nose is just a nose”.

If you really want to know if your nose is ok and any other comments on makeup or your clown clothing try competing at SASA. The first time I competed was in 2005. I competed as Novice Hobo/Tramp. Not to brag, but out of all the new Hobo Tramps in SASA and you know there were a lot of them—Of course—I took first place. OH-DON’T TELL ANYONE BUT OUT OF ALL THE ELIGIBLE CLOWNS ONLY 2 COMPETED. Ha!!! The judges had several constructive criticisms but the one that got me was they said that my mouth was too big. Being a new clown I just did not understand and was a little offended that they would say such a rude thing. They did not even know me and they were calling me a big mouth. Well, luckily, I finally figured out that they meant my white makeup was too wide and the more I studied other Hobo faces the more I realized they were right, of course. If you could see the change in my make up from then to now you would be surprised.

We do not often have the chance to speak with a pro like Leon McBride but that is ok. We have many years of experience with the clowns in our groups and, especially at places like SASA, any of the Shrine clowns will be glad to help a Brother. Use that knowledge to improve your clowning.

One more little tip. How do you answer the inevitable question, “Are you a real clown?” Just say back “Are you a real little boy/girl?” That usually catches them off guard and you can then change the subject. Keep on clownin’ and remember we do it for the kids.

It's that time of the year, Mid-winter at the Sea Mist in Myrtle Beach is upon us, hope to see a lot of you there. As I have stated before, we are trying to get SASCA back to it's roots for Mid-Winter. Teach, instruct, show! Have GOOD instructors to show different techniques of applying makeup, instruct our clowns in proper costuming and show them ways of putting on mini skirts. If you don't believe it works, get your older members to pull out some of the pictures of the unit in the 60's, 70's and 80's, then look at your makeup now. Even better, get them to show you their Stiens Makeup (all of us "Old Fogeys still have some somewhere!) Now you know what we used to have to do to apply our faces. Some of us even learned how to water-proof our makeup so we could do Aquatics clowning. There were only a couple of clowns around that could or would teach makeup unless you were part of their "Alley", and Shrine Clowns were at the bottom of the heap as far as "Professional" clowns were concerned. After all, we were "stealing" their livelihood!!! Well, thanks to some good costumers, shoemakers, make-up companies and "Professional" Clowns who were also "Shrine Clowns", that changed over the years so that we now have some of the best Clowns out there, and we should ALL strive to be the VERY BEST there is. The way to do that is with proper training and good makeup and costumes. Your makeup kit and costume are your most expensive items, but good costumes can be used to mix and match as new pieces are added, and can last a lifetime. Starting out as a 150# Shrine Clown and ending up a 267# Clown, I managed to pass along quite

a few costumes that are STILL being used, however, I find that Quality Wigs, especially Auguste Bald Wigs (skin tone cloth top) have become very scarce and are getting more and more expensive, so if you find a good one, take good care of it. I finally went to a Beautician and had her wash and set and spray mine, then I bought a plastic head and wig box to transport it. I have New Clowns that are still using "Griffin Clown Shoes" that were made in the 50's and 60's, and they still look as good as those made today. A good shoe shop can resole a well made pair of Clown shoes, bu I will admit, the new stuffing is a WHOLE LOT LIGHTER than the old horse hair stuffing!

On to more news, don't forget our Fall Convention in Myrtle Beach on September 29 th. Thru the 22 nd. We DO have rooms available at the Sea Mist again. Rooms are from \$55.00 to \$66.00 with 13% tax added. If you decide to come, all rooms are within the general area of the Conference Center so that you may walk wherever you go here.

One more reminder for ALL. The IMPERIAL session will be in Charlotte, NC in July. Guy's, this is a once in a lifetime chance as there is no telling when IMPERIAL will again be that close. We had hoped to have something from ISCA on the CLOWN COMPETITION, however RC did not get a chance to send me any Information. I do understand that it is in the current issue of ISCA's Clown Alley. If you are NOT a member, NOW is the time to contact RC or one of the other Officers and Past Officers and get your application in. I'm sure RC will be happy to sign you up in Myrtle Beach during the Mid-Winter meeting.

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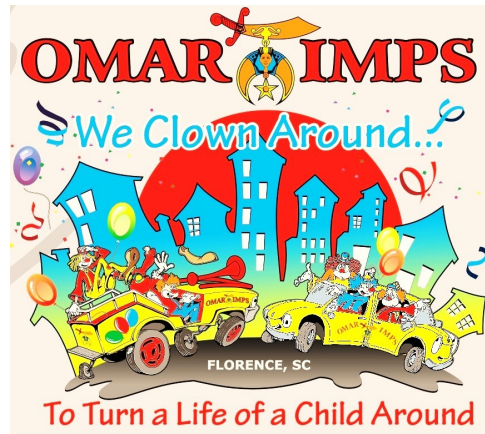
