FOCUS ON JESUS



We give all the glory to God, who has blessed us with all spiritual blessings in Christ Jesus, in this glorious vision. We are also blessed with the gifts of men and women whom God has chosen to keep the flag flying for our savior Jesus Christ till He returns.

In the book of Hebrews 12: 1-2(KJV) the writer through the Spirit admonished us to “lay aside every weight and the sin”. These are the kind of things that can block our views when we are trying to focus. Our focus on Jesus must not be shifted if we really want to see Him when He returns. Elijah told Elisha (2 Kings 2:10) that if he can see him when the Lord will take him away, then the double portion of the spirit he requested shall be received. The bottom line is, Elisha had to focus on Elijah for him not to have missed the opportunity. We know he was empowered because he saw Elijah at the moment he was taken away.

In this article, we will examine how important it is to focus on Jesus.

It is clear that when are serving two masters it is very difficult to focus on one because both will be pulling us in their direction. To serve our Lord Jesus, we must forsake others and focus on Him only. Kelly Balarie said, “the world tries to tell us that we need to be rich and famous; but we should realize that the world is not our maker and master.” Unfortunately, some of us still believe that it is. In today’s world, the words of enjoyment and comfort often sound louder than the word of God. Lack of focus has been the weapon of choice the devil has been using against us as Christians. It’s time we reject the advances of the devil and his beckoning so that we can focus on Jesus only. Distractions make us lose focus

We can learn a lesson or two from Peter as recorded in Matthew 14:29. Peter came out of the boat and was walking on the water, but in the middle of the way to Jesus he got distracted and began to sink. As humans, we love to follow signs that direct us to pleasure and enjoyment and as a result, we get sidetracked. The question is, how can we sift through the distractions and set our focus on Jesus?

Some of the practical ways to stay focus are:

Commit to reading the Bible - Scripture reading will draw our attention again and again to Christ. In John 5:39, Jesus says “search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me”. So, as we constantly read the scriptures, His words will consistently direct our focus.

Develop a prayer life - As we speak to the Lord throughout our day, we will naturally be more focused on Him. The word of God commanded us to “Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

Trust the Lord as our only protector - Psalm 25:15 teaches us to set our eyes on the Lord so that He can deliver us. Once we understand the spiritual dangers we face on a daily basis, it will help us to focus more on the Lord.

Recognize our need and the Lord as the source of all good things. According to Psalm 123:2, as we look unto the hand of the Lord to supply our need we become more focused on Him

National Youth and Young Adult Conference 2017

Glory be to God for a successful completion of the 2017 Youth and Young People Conference which took place in Chicago from July 6 – 9 2017. Conference theme: Jeremiah 51: 20

As a member of National Executive Council in attendance, I want to commend the National Leaders of the Movement for a well-organized and effectively-executed arrangements. Though I was not privileged to be at the Friday picnic because of the NEC meeting in session, report by other church leaders in attendance described the environment was decent and behavior godly. The Conference was loaded with interesting programs: morning devotion with Deacon Aaron Fakunle's expository Orientation titled: "ENLISTING TO BE THE CHOSEN ONE"; sub: "EXPOSING THE ENEMY'S AGENDA." Afternoon session: they broke into groups to listen to various Speakers; and the evening award/dinner night – held at a venue out of the hotel. The Sunday devotion and farewell service was spirit-lifting and challenging to all in attendance. In his sermon taken from Jeremiah 51: 20 – 23, "Thou art my battle axe and weapon of war". Pastor Temitope David emphasized the 4-C's: Call (calling), Caller, Called, and Commitment. Alter call brought almost all youth on their feet before the Lord affirming their determination not to remain the same and to be vessel for the Lord as they depart to their various Assemblies.

In a prophecy by the Washington DC District Prophet, Pastor David Abiodun, the Lord indicated that the purpose of the Conference is a portrayal of the promising future of the Glorious Vision. The Lord revealed abominations of the Nation, the Church, and men and women that dishonor and pervert the natural use of their own bodies. The Lord enjoined all to live in obedience to His laws, be purified as a vessel; particularly that the Youth and Young people obey the code of conduct governing them, wear the garment of righteousness as He has empowered them to blow the trumpet of repentance to the dying and spread the message forgiveness and holiness. The Lord called for ordination among their leaders, but because of time, the Chairman, Pastor E O Falaye directed that the ordination and appointment be performed by the respective District Apostle at a future date to be determined by them. At a short meeting on Saturday, the National Executive Council appreciated Pastor Ayodele Ajayi for his roles as National Leader of the Youth and Young People for over eight years. Henceforth, he was urged to focus his great efforts and determination to establish the Arizona Assembly of the Church. New national officers were Pastor James Temitope David as National Youth Leader, Elder Aaron Fakunle as Assistant National Youth Leader. They are requested to constitute a national committee and report to the NEC as soon as possible.

Pastor E.O. Falaye announced the Theme of the 2018 National Convention, which is: "**BE PREPARED, CHRIST IS COMING AGAIN !**" - (Luke 12: 40).

Overall, the Conference was well planned, organized and executed. The youth behaved in exemplary Godly manner – observing all rules and regulations, maintained high level of decorum, none of them was caught roaming the hallways or making noise. It was announced that the 2019 Youth Conference will be in Atlanta, GA!

NATIONAL YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT CONFERENCE 2017

The year 2017 has been quite a progressive year in The Apostolic Church National Youth Ministry. The year has featured several life-changing events, seminars, fellowships and Youth Sundays in our various assemblies spread across the United States. The most remarkable of all was our National Conference which took place in the state of Illinois in a small city called Skokie on the outskirts of Chicago from July 6 through July 9. This grand event brought together several youth and young adults of varying backgrounds and from different states and assemblies. This influx of youth, for the purpose of a spiritual revival and reawakening, definitely left an indelible mark in Skokie.



The 2017 National Youth and Young Adult Conference themed “Enlisting to be the Chosen One” taken from Jeremiah 51: 20 had about 250 youth and young adults in attendance. This 3-day spiritual reawakening event started each day with an “Early Morning Cry”, a 1-hour devotion and prayer session that taught the youth and young adults the importance of starting each day with God.

The main focus was to encourage and enlighten everyone that starting one’s day with prayers and communication with God not only sets the pace for the day but also keeps you spiritually alert and focused for the rest of the day.

The winners from the **Youth Ministry** were: **1st Place** – Mfon Akpan, Washington DC Assembly; **2nd Place** – Adebola Akinwale, Washington DC Assembly; **3rd Place** – Sanmi Akinola, Newark HQ.

The seminars were in the form of breakout sessions to ensure that the needs of each age group were adequately met. There were three groups, which included the Youths (young people ages 13-17), the Singles and Young Adults (ages 18-Up) and Marriage Ministry. Each group had capable and knowledgeable speakers who interacted and left a lasting impact on the attendees. Saturday was capped off with an Award and Dinner Night, a first of its kind. This was a huge success where several members within the ministry were recognized for outstanding performances academically and their involvement at the last conference or at their local assemblies.



An academic scholarship was also awarded for the first time. The final recipients were selected after carefully going through entries



submitted. One of the Academic Scholarship was named after Emmanuel Seun Ojo, one of our young adults who laid down his sword at the feet of Christ on July 8, 2016. 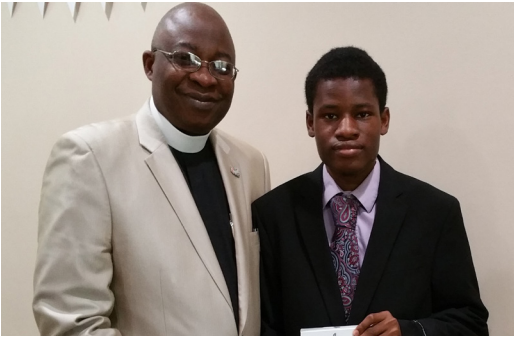

INSIGHTS FROM THE BOOK OF GALATIANS



Ever since I started going to my church, my family and I had been attending a session we call Bible study. I will like to share what we have been reading and discussing about the whole of Galatians, written by Paul, for the past few weeks. This book shines light on the truth and gives both the Galatians and ourselves a better understanding of what it means to be a Christian. In the book of Galatians, Paul wrote a letter to the churches of Galatia. In chapter 1, Paul said that after all the things God had done for them, they had already moved on to another god. Then, he used himself as an example; how God turned him from a prosecutor of Christians to an apostle of Christ. Even people who used to be afraid of him began to glorify God's power in his life. This point was made throughout verses 13-24.

In chapter 2, Paul talked more about his new life as an Apostle. He even mentioned when people tried to kidnap him but failed. After sharing that, Paul stated that God has no favorites, and that no one is different or better than anyone else in the face of God. After that, for rest of the chapter, Paul shares his experiences with a group of hypocritical gentiles. Paul started the third chapter by calling the Galatians foolish, for forgetting God after all He did, that Jesus even died on the cross. He then reminded them that even, since Abraham's time, God has rewarded people for their faithfulness in him, and that faith is the key to all blessings. The next few verses talks about how the law is not against the promises of God. This means that there is no such excuse as breaking the law for God. The law is meant to bring us towards Christ, not away.

Chapter 4's main point was that God sent his son that was born through a woman, under the law. So, we have graduated from servants to children. Paul used Abraham's sons as an example.

Paul said that the people who wait on the law to judge them do not have grace, because, people with the spirit get judged by faith. Paul then asked them to love each other; otherwise, the church might turn against each other. So, walk with the spirit and avoid the lust of flesh. Then he lists the works of the flesh and the fruit of the spirit.

Application: Apostle Paul is telling us, that when we have a strong relationship with God, we should not keep it to ourselves. Instead, we should spread the word to people who do not know Christ.
