Just a quick reminder to everyone, there is not a program planned for the December meeting as our guild Christmas Party will be held at our December meeting and remember it will be the first meeting at the Glazier Center - our new location.

Looking ahead to January 16, 2019, Kelly Young will be our speaker. Her topic, My Quilt Infatuation, will discuss keeping uniformity in scrap quilts. Her book, "Stash Statement Quilts", will be available for purchase for everyone and especially for those planning to attend the workshop the following day on January 17, 2019 from 9.30 – 3.30 at Quilt n Sew in Katy, TX.
