OPEN FOR TOURS ON SUNDAYS

The Haldeman Mansion will be open for tours on Sundays from 1:00 to 4:00 pm beginning May 7 through the end of October with guest speakers on the 3rd Sunday of each month. The Haldeman Mansion is located at 230 Locust Grove Road, just ¼ mile off Route 441 in Bainbridge.

The property, also known as Locust Grove, is on the National Register of Historic Places. Built around 1740, the oldest building is the summer kitchen/smokehouse which was the original homestead. It has a loft, a squirrel tail oven that is still in use and a fireplace with the original wood mantel. The thirteenroom stone mansion had its beginning in 1760 with just two rooms on the first floor and two on the second floor. Additions in 1790 and in 1811 completed this magnificent structure. Outstanding features are the numerous fireplaces and the elegant Federal stairway which is open to the third floor.

The Haldeman Mansion is the birthplace and childhood home of Samuel S. Haldeman (1812-1880), a distinguished scientist, author, and internationally recognized naturalist and philologist.
