
- **Committed** I am committed to showing up without distractions in our times of sharing so that I can experience and show God's Grace.

    - Walk by faith and not by sight!


### How to walk by faith...

  - "Come Follow Me!"






- Meet Hagar

    - A visionary to God




### Lessons from Hagar






- God Used the Broken Pieces

John 4:4 – 26 | Excerpt: John 4:4 – 10

**Jesus Talks With a Samaritan Woman** 



4 Now Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that he was gaining and baptizing more disciples than John— 2 although in fact it was not Jesus who baptized, but his disciples. 3 So he left Judea and went back once more to Galilee. 4 Now he had to go through Samaria. 5 So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. 6 Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about noon. 7 When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" 8 (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.) 9 The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans. 10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

  - Our brokenness doesn't disqualify us
  - Our brokenness is our blessing
    - 2 Corinthians 12:8 10
    - For My Grace is sufficient for you
    - For My Strength is made perfect in your weakness



- From our brokenness God gives us a mission and a ministry
  - Isaiah 61:3
  - God will give us a crown of beauty for ashes
  - The oil of joy for mourning






**38** As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. **39** She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. **40** But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" **41** "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, **42** but few things are needed—or indeed only one.[a] Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."





- Out of the abundance of her heart her mouth spoke! Luke 6:45





1	Meditation	Christian meditation, very simply, is <b>the ability to hear God's voice and to obey His word."</b> (17) Unlike Eastern meditation which seeks detachment, the goal of Christian meditation is a closer walk with the Lord. $(17 - 20)$	Exodus 3:1 - 7		
2	Prayer	<b>Prayer is listening</b> it is something that we learnit is an expression of our dependence upon God." (38 – 40) Our prayers are both personal and corporate, they are both simple and at times complex.	1 Samuel 1:9 – 28		
3	Fasting	Fasting reminds us that we are sustained "by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." Food does not sustain us; God sustains us. In Christ." (55)	Esther 4:15 – 17		
4	Study	Study is a specific kind of experience in which through careful attention to reality <b>the mind is enabled to move</b> in a certain directionthe direction of the Truth of Jesus Christ which sets us free." Study involves repetition, concentration, comprehension, and reflection. (61-66)	2 Timothy 2:14 - 19

	5	Simplicity	A life of simplicity requires our acknowledgement of our addiction to consumption (things, thoughts, accomplishments), and our desire to open this addiction up to the healing grace of God. (91)	Matthew 6:33	
	6	Solitude	In solitude God draws us away from our distractions so that we can see him more clearly and love Him more dearly. Unless we can SHOW UP in silence and solitude with God, we will never be able to FOCUS for others. (103)	Luke 5:1 - 16	
	7	Submission	Remembering that "the purpose of Disciplines is freedom" (110) the purpose of submission is simply to LET GO and to LET GOD! In so doing, we are able to forgive without condition and to love without restraint.	Matthew 23:8 – 10, Philippians 2:8	
	8	Service	Nothing disciplines the inordinate desires of the flesh like service, and nothing transforms the desires of the flesh like serving in hiddenness." (130) Unlike self-righteous service, the objective of true service is not the act of serving – but the joy of becoming a servant of God!	John 13:1 - 17




