Book Baby wants your business, but also offers free emails with things like "5-step self-publishing guide" free for downloading.

BRIDGE TO PUBLICATION, MARKETING

Copy, right?

So you've written your final draft, and you're ready to send it off to agents, publishers, or self-publishing. USA copyright law says it is copyrighted once you have written it. But if you want to register that copyright with the US copyright office, you visit **eco.copyright.gov** and make an account. You pay a small fee, like \$60. I think, and upload your copy to the website.

People who heard my talk know that I recommend that you do this. I registered my "Troll Move" in 1992, many years before Dreamworks came out with their Troll movies. So I'm protected. Imagine trying to find a publisher and convincing them that my troll stories are original, not derivatives of the current motion pictures. Not gonna happen.
