

An Eighteen-year-old

This account is set in Nigeria: parts of Ireland suffered kidnappings and murder, so this is not an attack on Nigeria.

Early this month a man claimed he killed a Nigerian student for the priesthood because he would not stop announcing the Christian faith in captivity. He took responsibility for the murder because Michael Nnadi "continued preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ" to his captors.

Mustapha Mohammed (currently in jail) praised his "outstanding bravery" and Nnadi "told him to his face to change his evil ways or perish".

Four of some 270 seminarians were kidnapped. Gunmen disguised in military camouflage broke in, opened fire, stole laptops and phones, and kidnapped the four for ransom.

Ten days later one was found on the side of a road, alive but badly injured. Two more were released later.

Some time later Nnadi's body was identified by the rector of the seminary.

Eighteen years old.

When we're wrong and someone points it out, we know we're wrong but can get angry. This is probably an extreme example which led to martyrdom.

We pray for peace throughout our own country and throughout Nigeria.
