Who Wants to Go to Iraq this Week?

The Pope goes to Iraq on Friday (I'm writing this on Wednesday).

Pope Francis and his aides are well aware of the security and health risks involved with this trip. "The best way to interpret this journey is as an act of love, an act of love for this land, for this people, for its Christians" said the director of the Vatican press office, Matteo Bruni.

Iraq is a diverse place, permanently divided between different communities (Shia,Sunni, Kurds, Christians, Yazidis), each with their own religious or ethnic culture. Each community carefully guarded its identity and traditions.

Pope Francis will visit the main church in Qaraqosh, its wall blackened by fire, and the former Christian enclaves in Mosul. The exodus of Christians continues unabated.

Travelling while the coronavirus pandemic is continuing (and worsening in Iraq) and at a time when sporadic acts of terrorist violence have increased slightly is a measure of the pope's consideration and attention.

All of the precautions have been taken from a health point of view, Bruni said, with the pope and everyone travelling with him (including about 70 members of the media) having been vaccinated against the virus by the Vatican. The only event scheduled with more than 200 people is a Mass on Sunday 7 March in a stadium in Irbil, which seats 30,000 people, but fewer than 10,000 free tickets were printed.
