CASTLE VIEW WILD LIFE WALK



The Castle View Wildlife Walk preparations are coming along well – over the last few weeks our volunteers have dug over and weeded as much as possible with the TC removing two large piles of waste - to get the ground ready for the Town Council to come in and rotivate in February.

Following subsequent weed treatment, the area will be prepped again by the Friends volunteers ready for re-sowing with perennial and annual wildflower seeds.

Wildlife boxes

Bird and bat boxes have now been installed along the wildlife walk, as part of the overall wildlife walk project. A survey was carried out on Facebook to find out the most regular wildlife visitors to this area to help decide what type of accommodation to go for. A mix of woodcrete boxes for different birds and bats were chosen.



second occasion the police were called by a vigilant Bath Ground user and the car was confiscated and impounded. The perpetrators were issued with warning letters as well as a fine to get their car out of police custody. So a good result! The bollard outside the cricket club has since been secured.

DOG RESPONSIBILITY

'BAG it & BIN it'

We continue to review dog responsibility on the Bath

Grounds. Over the winter we have noticed and have been made aware by users that there has been an increase in dog mess on the bath grounds The dark nights seem to be a precursor to dog owners not picking up after their dogs. We will be doing some more spot flagging over the next few weeks to raise awareness and remind dog owners of their responsibilities



BINS

The Bath Grounds now has eight bins which are used for both general litter and disposing of dog bags. This is a system that that many councils are now using, as ultimately dog waste and general waste are combined once they arrive at waste disposal sites and are treated together.



ASB

Incidents of ASB have been much reduced over the last 6 months. As a result of regular meetings between the Friends, the Town Council, NWLDC, the police and the cricket club, a number of actions were taken to secure the bath grounds embankment from the Royal Hotel carpark with large boulders, the improved lighting on the carpark

and the addition of further security cameras has significantly reduced ASB. The closing of the Cricket Club gates by the Town Council and the timely replacement of bollards again has significantly reduced ASB and



damage to the Bath Grounds. The work of the police also resulted in a large number of warning letters to individuals found to be causing ASB in this area.

There have been a couple of incidences of a car driving on the bath grounds in January, access from the cricket club end where a metal bollard had been damaged. On the



We have had a few observations of dog walkers leaving dog bags by the side of bins rather than putting the dog bag into the bin - we will continue to monitor this situation, as it is still early days with the dual use bins for the Bath Grounds.
