**Artist Statement**: 'Depicts Cookie when he realised Te Wai Pounamu (South Island) and Te Ika a Maui (North Island) weren't connected, the reason why it's named the 'Cook Strait'. The Ika\* in his ears are a metaphor to Tupaia, an Arioi from Raiatea; there is no existing image of Tupaia. He was Cookie's constant guide and translator on his first voyage.'

\*(noun) fish, marine animal, aquatic animal - any creature that swims in fresh or salt water including marine mammals such as whales.
