

I have discovered that most people do not know the reason that St Saviours has no apostrophe, so I have asked for the history so that I can share it with you.

Nick Empson shares his knowledge: "There are historical associations with the church of St Saviours that interfere with what we would regard as normal English. It is French, and medieval French at that." The church was built and named St Saviours by the Europeans who first came here.

JEAN (John) Aubin was born on the island of Jersey off the coast of France in 1831. He arrived in Auckland, New Zealand on the ship, Ganges in October, 1863. He made his way to the small township of Alexandra (later renamed Pirongia) on the Waipa River where, in December 1864, he established a small trading post.

St Saviours Church (*St Sauveur*) is the parish church of <u>St Saviours, Guernsey</u>. St Saviours is the largest of Guernsey's country churches . It occupies a commanding site above a deep valley. The parish church existed at least as early as 1087. When Jean Aubin arrived in Waipa, he provided much of the finance for the original church and also named it after the church in his homeland, St Saviours.
