

FUNDING NOW AVAILABLE TO SUPPORT SMALL COMMUNITY PROJECTS IN GREY

The Federal Government is providing a further \$150,000 in funding for small-scale upgrades and new equipment for community groups in Grey.

• Expressions of interest are now open for Round 7 of the Stronger Communities Programme, giving local governing bodies and community groups an opportunity to nominate projects for grants of up to \$20,000.

Federal Member for Grey Rowan Ramsey said the Stronger Communities grants had been very important program for regional communities and a regular winner for Grey.

• "I am always amazed at how much bang for our buck we get by giving support for community-based organisations," he said. "They add volunteer labour, their own finances and get great value for money.

"This latest funding injection will support up to 20 projects across our communities, delivering an economic activity by providing work to local businesses and adds. Even if in a modest way to our recovery as we come out of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Previous rounds have brought \$900,000 to Grey for projects such as turning rubbish bins into historical landmarks in Port Augusta, purchasing a marquee and security fencing for the Port Lincoln Tunarama, restoring the Edithburgh tidal pool, installing a disability access ramp for the Burra Community and Sports Club and ensuring a sustainable water supply to the Beltana hall to name just a few.

"This type of investment brings people together by strengthening social connections, building community participation and delivering a brighter and more vibrant future for communities.

- "I strongly encourage interested organisations to contact my office regarding projects important to them and our community. Grants from \$2,500 up to \$20,000 are available to cover up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs, or up to 50 per cent of eligible project costs for local governing bodies."
- Mr Ramsey said it is important to note Expressions of Interest for applicants in Grey must be received by his office by Friday 3rd December.

THOUGHTS FROM THE PADDOCK

G'day Folks!

Harvest has begun on lentil and barley crops in the last week as farmers begin to get grain into storage where it's safe from adverse weather. Last Thursday's severe thunderstorm wreaked havoc and reduced grain yield in some paddocks as damaging wind shattered crops, blew trees over, moved anything loose and loosened anything that wasn't.

Despite the very dry spring, there are some

pretty handy crops around. With strong world demand for grain, prices are reasonable and they need to be to support the massive recent increases in the cost of fuel and fertiliser.

Growing season rainfall; from April to October, of 236 mm is well below the average of 297 mm and a lot less than last year's 324 mm, though this year's rain was more timely and consequently most crops will probably perform slightly better. Annual rainfall so far, of 268 mm, is much lower than the long term average of 354 mm to the end of October.

Hay is all but wound up on most farms, and while it is of lower value than recent years, quality and quantity were good.

Many farmers have been busy with shearing during the last couple of months, or crutching to prepare sheep for summer with a low risk of flystrike. Lambs have been weaned and rams purchased or prepared for joining. Strong demand for Australian wool and lamb has continued.

As the weather warms up, I wish everyone a safe harvest season! - A Brinky Farmer.




