PASTOR'S CORNER I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. (1 Corinthians 3:6)

My family has just a couple small beds in our backyard so that Jonathan and I can dabble in the dirt, but I have friends who are serious gardeners and farmers. It is incredible to be in that time of abundance. Other times, the water seems to be a dribble and the spiritual food seems to not taste so good or fill us up so much. Those drought times can be so frustrating and discouraging. Yet whether in times of abundance or times of drought, God can still cause us to grow. We can still increase our trust on Jesus, our ability to love and forgive, our capacity to sacrifice for others and treat those around us with compassion and grace. We can become more like Jesus – because God causes us to grow if we'll let him.

I don't know what sort of season you are in right now. Whether abundance or drought, I pray that God will care for the seed of faith planted deep within you, nourish it with many hands and hearts, and nurture your spirit so that it may flourish in wisdom, maturity, and faith.

Church Council Announcement on Masking at Grace Hills May 20, 2021

Last week (5/13/21), the CDC changed its guidelines regarding the use of masks by fully vaccinated persons in the United States, stating that masks were no longer required for safety by those fully vaccinated. The next day (5/14/21), the governor of Virginia rescinded the mask mandate for the state, stating that while individual companies and organizations may continue to institute mask rules, and individuals may choose to wear masks, the legal requirement to mask in public settings and social gatherings was hereby rescinded.

We are grateful for the efficacy of the available COVID vaccines and rejoice that the efforts against the ongoing pandemic are being so successful. In response to these announcements from the CDC and the governor, the Church Council met on May 19, 2021, to discuss the next steps for Grace Hills regarding masking. *Continued on next page...*

The Council looked at the current vaccination rates for Appomattox, discussed the circumstances of our congregation, and considered the concerns of those attending worship in-person. One very important factor was the current ineligibility of children under the age of 12 to receive any vaccine, and the reality that, though children 12-17 can receive the vaccine, those receiving a two-shot regimen are not yet fully vaccinated. The Council **unanimously** expressed a desire to protect our children from COVID, as well as encourage them to continue in safe practices until they are eligible to be vaccinated (which will, of course, be an individual family decision).

With this in mind, the Church Council is recommending the following practice at Grace Hills until children are eligible to receive the COVID vaccine and become fully vaccinated:

The call of Jesus to "Love your neighbor as yourself" and "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them" is a powerful one, and one that guides all we do as followers of Jesus. In light of this, Grace Hills Baptist Church requests that everyone who attends indoor worship services, or other indoor activities where children currently ineligible to receive the vaccine or who have not had time to become fully vaccinated are present, wear a face mask out of concern for our youngest brothers and sisters and to encourage them in their practice of safe behaviors.

Our congregation has been a blessing to our community by adopting safe practices and caring for others throughout this pandemic. Let each of us choose to continue this approach to protect and set the example for our youngest companions in the community of faith.


