of images. This presentation suggests that Basketmaker Anasazi people and the Zuni

Pueblo people may have shared some elements of the Flower World. Three groups of

Basketmaker rock art images found in Southeastern Utah are viewed through the origin

myths and ceremonies of the Zuni Flute God. We can discover significance in the rock

art and increase our understanding of the people through Flower World imagery.

Mary Lou and Howard Christy have volunteered to join the board.


We still have openings on the board and we are actively looking for volunteers to assist us. Please contact me or any of the other board members if you are interesting
