Not sure if the living is as easy as it used to be, but here at Hoge Memorial Presbyterian Church, we're working on it....Greetings from Pastor Tom! It's hard to believe, but it's been a year now since Hoge reopened to live worship, after being closed for 3 months. And there are still churches which are closed for live worship due to the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic – Our Session felt last June that is was critical to reopen our church for our neighborhood – You see, we have people in our midst that depend upon us! Our food pantry feeds 200 – 300 families in our neighborhood on a regular basis; Our HM3 Saturday evening worship service feeds 65 people each week, and we hand out personal care items each month that people in our neighborhood come to depend on.....Our church hosts outside support groups nearly every day of the week, and they need us and depend on us! So you see, it was imperative for us to reopen, so we could serve the needs of our neighborhood, and spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ.....Speaking of spreading the Gospel, Jesus said in Matthew 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, Baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and The Holy Spirit – Teaching them to observe all that Jesus has commanded you - And I will be with you always, to the end of the ages!" Do you feel overwhelmed to share the Gospel message of the "Good News" to your family and friends? I hope you were able to catch Rev. Wayne Morrison's sermon that he gave last Sunday, May 23rd – If not, get on Hoge's Facebook page and listen to it - Rev. Wayne had prepared a sermon for us but decided that The Holy Spirit was leading him in a different way last Sunday, so he gave us his own personal testimony how he came to be a disciple of Jesus Christ - This was a powerful message! Rev. Wayne reminded all of us how easy it can be to evangelize for our Lord Jesus Christ - We just need to tell our own personal tes-

timony of how we came to be a follower of Jesus Christ – This is something we all can do, because nobody knows our Christian -conversion story better than.....YOU! Rub onions over silverware to **remove rust stains**; **Decrease the tarnishing** process on silver, put chalk pieces in cheesecloth store the whole thing with your cutlery; **Clear drains** by adding 1 cup of baking soda, 1 cup of white vinegar. Twenty minutes later, rinse. The same mixture applied to shower heads; Fill a spray bottle with half vinegar, half water, and spray the **shower walls** with it after every rinse to dispel mold/mildew; One crushed aspirin added to a gallon of water and poured in the soil helps **plants stay alive** during transplanting, cutting, etc. This aspirin solution will also keep your cut flowers fresher longer; If you want to make a **flower bed** where grass is growing, in the fall mow a patch of lawn to accommodate the space (cont. page 7)

Use the mixture to spray on plants to **kill aphids** and other garden pests; Put an **apple in your potato bag** to keep the potatoes from budding; Soak **blackened pots** in water with two denture (or antacid) tablets overnight. Denture tablets in water will also clean the residue that clings to the inside of vases; Clean your **microwave** by placing a glass bowl filled with 1/4 cup vinegar and 1 cup water inside, heat five minutes, use a cloth dipped in it to wipe; Toss thin lemon rinds & ice cubes in **garbage disposal**; add some salt to **boil eggs** keeps shells from doing that annoying cracking thing.
