### Corpus Christi 2020

Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi and Beyond

The third of these important feasts is today, celebrating Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

You can go to Mass any day, substituting a weekday for Saturday evening/ Sunday. What happens if you go to Mass on a Wednesday (for example) and want to make your weekly contribution to the Common Fund and to the Share collection? Well, I'm sure we'll get suggestions about that.

So, there might be great homilies on weekdays as well as Saturdays/Sundays. It gets more complicated all the time.
