


Craft items will be on display and can be taken at the end of the auction. If you purchase a dessert or service, you will need to work out the details as to delivery with the person donating.

Decluttering of Photographs

This is a hard area for me - we have boxes and boxes of old photographs at our home. At one time I did place the photos into photo albums but as time went on, the pile of pictures has become over whelming.

As in the previous articles- the first step is to decide what your goals are. Do you want to keep all the photos? How much of the mountain of photos would you be willing to part with? Do you want to scrap book the photos, place them in photo albums or do you want to use photo boxes?

Decide if you want to do this all-in-one day, a weekend, or maybe a little at a time. Gather all your photos together- lay out just the ones you want to sort through. I would use my dinning room table since I can spread them out.

Start to sort through the photos-place photos from certain dates or events together. Such as Christmas 1999, Christmas 2022, Trip to New York 1987- you get the picture. Pun intended. Maybe sort each family member and place them together.

Look for duplicates and put it with its match. Yes, there was a time that when your photos were developed you were given two copies of each. Sorting your pictures will help with both the decluttering and organizing process.



Try not to get too caught up or distracted as you look at the pictures. Your goal on this step is simply to put them in time order the best you can.

Now is the hard part- tossing out some of those old photos- you probably do not need two of each picture- maybe make a photo box or album to give as a birthday or Christmas gift. Toss out photos that are out of focus or you just have no idea what the picture is. Maybe you just took tons of landscape pictures but now you're not even sure why. Do not hold onto photos that bring back unpleasant memories from the past. Hold the photo up- what emotion does it bring to you? What if you have no idea who is in the photo- ask other family members to help you identify them. The pictures may be of meaning or value to them even if they aren't to you.

Now that you know which photos your keeping- decide if you want to use photo albums or photo boxes.

Did you find an old photo in need of repair - there are companies than can repair your photo.

Another option is to have your photos digitalize. You can send your photos to a company to digitize them, or you could scan your photos yourself if you have that computer savvy.

Today not as many paper photos are printed- just remember to keep up with organizing your digital photos as well as your printed photos.

10 IDEAS FOR REACHING OUT TO OUR MOMS

Many churches around the globe, including Trinity, have been working hard to bring congregants who were previously engaged back through their church doors. Yet many are seeing diminishing returns – even continued drops in attendance. According to the 'Unstuck Church Report,' the average in-person attendance over the previous 12 months dropped by 28%.'1

It's time to recalibrate the focus of our ministries on one of the best kept secret demographic groups, moms. According to a 2019 Barna research article, "Churches should ask pointed questions about how they've set up their ministries and how they can best support moms as they help support their families."² Outside of women's ministries or a certain Sunday in May, how often does what we do in Church speak to the experiences of moms—whether single or married, working full-time or staying at home? No matter what kind of mom leads her family, moms, all moms, are positioned as the gateway to connecting families to churches.

We all see it, but do we come alongside to support and celebrate her work on a consistent basis?

FLOURISHING MOMS CREATE FLOURISHING CHURCHES AND CITIES.

Making a mom feel welcome, encouraged and valued starts with how we welcome them here on Sunday morning, but extends well beyond what we do here on Sundays.

Here are 10 Ideas for welcoming and seeing moms every Sunday:

- 1. Family Friendly Zones. (Can we put a sign on the back pew for Families with children?)
- 2. Play the Sermon in All Areas of the Church. (I checked-our Nursery speaker is working)
- 3. Offer Newcomer Maps for Families. (Any volunteers to create a map?)
- 4. Encourage a Mom. (We can all do more of this!)
- 5. Share Monthly Resource Packets for Families. (Kids Bulletins, Coloring Pages, and some crayons. What else can we add to this resource kit for moms?)
- 6. Communicate! (Moms are busy and need reminders of times/places for events and practices.)
- 7. Identify a Mom Point Person to Reach Out to Moms. (Can we get our Welcoming Group going again?)
- 8. Think Practical. (Moms are already overwhelmed. What else can we as the Church do to help ease the load for our moms?)
- 9. Partner with Other Organizations to reach out to moms. (What other organizations can we share with moms to help them in the toughest job in the world?)
- 10. Pray for moms! (I should have listed this first!)

These are just a few ideas I thought about this week. What else can we do to better support our moms? Oh, all you moms out there, we could use and will listen to your advice. We need everyone's help to better serve all our wonderful and appreciated moms! Please share your ideas with me or with our Mutual Ministry Team (Julie Kossler and Peggy Didier). 
