Following engagement received in January and February, the Sherburne County Parks Department has developed draft master plan concepts for a potential future County park on the shore of Big Elk Lake in Palmer Township. The potential park would complement and add outdoor recreation facilities to the County park system, such as camping, nature exploration, water recreation, and trails. The 430-acre property is currently in private ownership, and the owners are collaborating with Sherburne County staff on the master planning process to fulfill the wishes of the late owner, who desired that the land would become a public park. The private property has rich historic & cultural value.

The master plan will be structured to meet requirements established by the Greater Minnesota Regional Parks and Trails Commission (https://www.gmrptcommission.org/) for regional park designation. If approved, the master plan would allow Sherburne County to apply for funding to acquire the property for public use. The master plan will focus on ideas that create facilities for outdoor recreation, such as trails, picnic areas, and fishing piers, as well as restoration efforts to provide wildlife habitat and natural landscapes.



The property is located along the north side of Big Elk Lake in Palmer Township.

The property is privately owned and not accessible to the public.
