For Catholics, the liturgical season of Advent helps us focus on the spiritual preparation for Christmas and for the coming of Our Lord. When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's coming.

That's why on one hand, we reflect back on Our Lord's first coming, when He humbled Himself, becoming incarnate, and entering our time and space to free us from sin. On the other hand, we recall in the Creed that Our Lord will come again to judge the living and the dead, and that we must be ready to meet Him.

Dear parishioners and visitors of Holy Spirit Parish & Christ the King Mission: I prepared some very easy suggestions for you to help you prepare yourself for Christmas this year.

First, make an Advent Wreath for your family at home. I hope most of you have them already. Why is it important to have an Advent Wreath? The lights of the candles represent Christ, who entered this world to scatter the darkness of evil and show us the way of righteousness and love.

Second, pray daily. Hopefully, prayer is already part of your daily routine, but if not, make it one. Schedule a regular time for prayer with your family members. You can pray the rosary individually, or as a family. Ponder the various events in the life of Our Lord and the example of Mary, "the handmaid of the Lord," who gave of herself to receive the gift of the Savior.

Third, read Sacred Scripture. Try to spend a few minutes each day reflecting upon Bible Scriptures, and allow the Holy Spirit to speak in the quiet of your heart.

Fourth, take the time for Confession. Try to make a good examination of conscience, and go to a priest to confess your sins. Before confession, be sure to pray for light and help from the Holy Spirit. If you do not remember the sins that you committed long ago, just write down those sins on paper and read them to the priest. After you have finished, receive absolution from your sins, and be sure to complete the prescribed penance.

Fifth, catechize your children. In your free time, read the stories of St. Francis and the Christmas story to your children. Explain to them why we decorate a Christmas tree, and tell them about Saint Nicholas. **Sixth,** support the poor, financially or spiritually. Pray for the less fortunate during Christmas. Do not reject

the hands of those who ask you for help during this sacred time, because the Baby Jesus comes through them to your families.

Finally, give yourself to your family members by spending as much time with them as you can. Talk to them, and if you are holding any grudges in your heart toward anyone, let them go. Try to reconcile with those who hurt you deeply and forgive them as Jesus forgave us on His Cross.

During this special, sacred time of Christmas, try to do good works, say prayers for your family members, attend Mass, and make a sacrifice for a special intention. As true disciples of Christ, during Advent prepare to receive Jesus Christ as though He were coming for the first time. Make this Christmas a celebration of the birth of Our Savior and the great gift of faith you have received at your own Baptism. By striving to live in the presence of Christ during Advent, you will receive the best present of all — Our Savior who loves you so very much. God bless you all.
