# Cutcombe Christmas Show Report – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021

A marvellous entry on the day with the commercial sale of lambs and ewes seeing a total of 2,002 sheep forward for sale. The welcome return of the lamb carcass and poultry plus gift sales this year started the day.

**Poultry (30),** with a limited number forward in the poultry room, just the 30 entries with the top price of the day at £92.00 for Mr E Luxton's first prize and champion turkey being a 29.6lb bird. Others from the same home to £72.00 with the fourth prize being 23.8lbs, the second prize a 21lb bird to £60.00 and the third prize from Mr D Butt at £28.00, 65lbs in weight.

Geese topped for the reserve champion bird from Mr E Luxton again, being 22.2lbs and sold for £62.00. Others to £52.00 for Mr J Bomford and others from Mr E Luxton to £50.00 and £45.00 with a run from Mrs M Carey topping at £48.00 for her third prize winning bird.

A selection of chickens reached £20.00 for Mr E Luxton with others from Mr J Bomford to £28.00 and Mr IC Stevens to £22.00.

Lamb Carcasses (52), it was tremendous to have these classes available once more and to have the show go on. Noted prices included the champion of the day being Josh Govier in the YFC class who's lamb went on to sell for £190.00 to the judge Mr R Little of R Little Family Butchers in Watchet.

Other noted prices included a lamb given by Mr B & Mrs T Blackmore which was sold in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support and sold for £200.00. The top prices besides included Mr C Govier with a lamb to £160.00, M & S Hayes & Son to £155.00 and BJ & T Blackmore to £152.00. A lamb from J Muirhead to £150.00.

**Show Live Lambs,** topped at £166.00 for a tremendous pair from NK Nation at 77kgs with a second pair of 70kg lambs to £163.00. The Champion pen of show lambs from BJ & T Blackmore sold to £160.00 and the reserve champion from the same home sold to £120.00.

Prime New Season Lambs (1,298), met with a brisker than anticipated trade as lambs seem to have taken a knock this week. The overall average across all 1,298 stood at 256.5ppk with the SQQ at 263ppk. Top of the day from NK Nation for a pen of 14 that hit £166.50 (67kgs). Others from DW & J Jones saw pens of 21 at 60kgs to £149.50, 57.5kgs £144.50, 56kgs to £139.20 and 57kgs to £138.20. Others in this heavier weight range at 65kgs from GB Holloway to £140.00 and Mr P Land saw his 54kgs to £139.00 with a pair from DJ Vellacott at £136.50. GG Gribble saw their pen of six 57kgs to £145.50 and GL Steer saw his pen of 50.5kgs at the end of the day to £132.50 being equalled by a pen from RB & JE Stephens at 54kgs. RJ Nancekivell saw a pen of 14 to £128.80 at 52.5kgs.

**Medium Weights,** 45kgs from Wright & Wright hit £119.00 for a pen of 32 with 17 from AJ Mather to £118.00 for 44kgs, being equalled by a pen from GG Gribble. EJW & AJ & MJ Land saw their pen of 42 lambs at 42kgs to £116.20 and this was equalled by a pen from Wright & Wright. I Palmer & Son saw their 45kgs to £115.80 with Rackenford Manors 44kgs to £115.00.

**Lighter Weights,** saw 39kgs from Wrylands Farm at £109.50 and the same weight from Rackenford Manor to £106.00. A pen of 27 38kgs lambs from RJ Govier to £104.80 and JJ Floyd saw his 38.5kgs at £99.80. The average price of the lambs forward was £118.09.

**Store Lambs (31),** to an average of £102.32 and topped at £108.00 for a pen from Mr P Shopland of 12. Others from Wellshead Farm to £103.00 and KNK Farm Partnership to £100.00.

Grazing Ewes (671), sold to average £81.76, a tremendous price when you look at the number of hill ewes included in that total. Top of the day £144.50 for Messrs DW & J Jones, the champion pen of cull ewes being five Suffolk Mule ewes. P Shopland was second top with a single ewe at £138.50, others from Messrs Jones to £134.00 and £120.50, £119.00, £116.20 with Will Eliicott seeing his top at £125.00. D & N Butt to £119.50 and BJ & T Blackmore to £116.50.

Cull Rams (2), topped at £129.00 for HT & ME Bale & Son and others from RJ Govier to £95.50.

Lambs as already stated, much better than expected but down a touch with a knock in the prices seen across the board.
