Dear Friends at Trinity Lutheran Church,

(March 1, 2019 letter:)

Thank you for your generous gift of 6 quilts for LWR's distribution overseas. These gifts of your hearts and hands are beautiful expressions of God's grace and love to people all around the world.

Last year, LWR and partners Children's Gift Ministry (CGM) and OLAM were busy distributing 28,000 School Kits in Honduras, to children whose families are vulnerable due to lack of access to the most basic necessities. Parents often have to choose between feeding their children and sending them to school. These Kit donations will help them get back to or stay in school, increasing their chances of breaking the chains of chronic poverty and avoiding the very real risk of gang involvement. In addition to being practical, these kits provide a source of comfort, security and hope to those who receive them.

(March 6, 2019 letter:)

I'm excited to be able to share some details about where some of your items traveled in the last year. Your donations departed our Maryland warehouse in late November of 2018.

LWR's partner for this shipment is IMA World Health, an organization that works to strengthen health systems, prevent and treat disease, promote nutrition and hygiene, respond to sexual and gender-based violence, and promote maternal and child health. This shipment of Mission Quilts and Personal Care Kits will serve an estimated 7,200 vulnerable women, men, and children in Port-de-Paix. Many of these families are affected by neglected tropical diseases and their lives disrupted by Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and more recently by the October 2018 earthquake.

(Additional March 6, 2019 letter:)

Your Mission Quilts donations departed our Marilyn warehouse in mid-December of 2018 and were sent to Iraq.

LWR's partner in Iraq is RNVDO, an organization partnering with the United Nations and others to coordinate relief efforts to those who are displaced; helping people who had fled and are returning home; and providing support to communities as they move toward early recovery and long-term health and sustainability. This shipment of Mission Quilts and Fabric Kits is serving nearly 22,000 people, providing life-saving warmth in the winter season and tools for learning a new trade along with hope for a bright future.

Ohio! Yes, I'm in Ohio. An unexpected trip home to help my parents move has resulted in many blessings!

God's audacious bounty

- I was able to be with my extended family on Easter! We had fifty adults and twentyeight children. Twenty of the children were 8 and under!
- I have been able to help Mom and Dad with their move. Forty-six years in one place. Raising kids, pigs and crops resulted in a lot of "stuff" to be sorted, distributed, sold or moved.
- Healthy good-byes. I have been able to spend quiet time on the farm saying my own good-byes. It's been a beautiful, bittersweet time.
- The reality of being able to do my work from most anywhere in the world continues to bless me. I have continued meeting with the global workers under my care as well as attend occasional video conferences.



Prayer Request from the "least of these":

I was traveling for a month in Central Asia and the Middle East. Two distinct, very different ministry areas yet I found the prayer requests coming from the children to be very similar. Will you join me in prayer?


- 11 year old boy: "Please pray that I would find a buddy." (this child is lonely and finding it difficult to meet boys in his neighborhood)
- 9 year old boy: "Please pray that I would be able to concentrate in school." (this child is struggling with paying attention to his school work)
- 11 year old boy: "Please pray that I will not get stuck thinking about things that I need to let God take care of." (this child



struggles with obsessive compulsive thinking)

- 12 year old girl: "Please pray I have friends." (this child has significant developmental and cognitive disabilities and is lonely)
- 17 year old young man who is lonely and isolated. 90% of interaction with his peers is on-line. He is lonely and isolated.
- Many of my families are homeschooling families, some a combination: younger children go to school and older children are homeschooled. Pray for their parents. And I do mean parents. It is typical for both mom and dad to be involved. Even with the internet, homeschooling is difficult for many families and unlike the US where there are often co-opts for children to participate in for social interaction, most of the families I work with are isolated, the children having limited contact with peers.

10 Early Signs and Symptoms of Alzheimer's

Memory loss that disrupts daily life may be a symptom of Alzheimer's or other form of dementia. Alzheimer's is a brain disease that causes a slow decline in memory, thinking and reasoning skills. There are 10 warning signs and symptoms. If you notice any of them, don't ignore them. Schedule an appointment with your doctor.

1. Memory loss that disrupts daily life

One of the most common signs of Alzheimer's disease, especially in the early stage, is forgetting recently learned information. Others include forgetting important dates or events, asking for the same information over and over, and increasingly needing to rely on memory aids (i.e. reminder notes or electronic devices) or family members for things they used to handle on their own.

2. Challenges in planning or solving problems

Some people may experience changes in their ability to develop and follow a plan or work with numbers. They may have trouble following a familiar recipe or keeping track of monthly bills. They may have difficulty concentrating and take much longer to do things than they did before.

3. Difficulty completing simple tasks at home, at work, or at leisure

People with Alzheimer's often find it hard to complete daily tasks. Sometimes, people may have trouble driving to a familiar location, managing a budget at work or remembering the rules of a favorite game.

4. Confusion with time or place

People with Alzheimer's can lose track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. They may have trouble understanding something if it is not happening immediately. Sometimes they may forget where they are or how they got there.

5. Trouble understanding visual

images and spatial relationships For some people, having vision problems is a sign of Alzheimer's. They may have difficulty reading, judging distance and determining color or contrast, which may cause problems with driving.

6. New problems with words in speaking and writing

People with Alzheimer's may have trouble following or joining a conversation. They may stop in the middle of a conversation and have no idea how to continue or they may repeat themselves. They may struggle with vocabulary, have problems finding the right word or call things by the wrong name (i.e. calling a "watch" a "hand-clock").

7. Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps

A person with Alzheimer's disease may put things in unusual places. They may lose things and be unable to go back over their steps to find them again. Sometimes, they may accuse others of stealing. This may occur more frequently over time.

8. Decreased or poor judgement

People with Alzheimer's may experience changes in judgement or decision-making. For example, they may use poor judgement when dealing with money (i.e. giving large amounts to telemarketers). They may pay less attention to grooming or keeping themselves clean.



9. Withdrawal from work or social activities A person with Alzheimer's may start to remove themselves from hobbies, social activities, work projects or sports. They may have trouble keeping up with a favorite sports team or remembering how to complete a favorite hobby. They also may avoid social activities because of the changes they have experienced.

10. Changes in mood or personality The mood and personalities of people with Alzheimer's can change. They can become confused, suspicious, depressed, fearful or anxious. They may be easily upset at home, at work, or with friends. If you notice any of the 10 Warning Signs don't ignore them. Schedule an appointment with your doctor.
