

Greetings:

This month I want to talk about the circuit ministry that is happening in our conference. In 2021 "circuits" were formed throughout the state at the direction of the District Superintendents and the idea was that as the number of districts went from 8 to 5 it was increasingly difficult for clergy and churches to participate in anything across the district. Our district, Camp Clear Lake, extends from Northwood to Okoboji, down to HWY. 20 to give you an idea of how large of an area it is now. The circuits are meant to create smaller groups within the larger district. Our circuit includes the communities of Manly/Bolan, Mason City, Dows, Plymouth/Rock Falls/Nora Springs/Rudd, Bradford/Lee Center, and Clarion. Since this is a large area for everyone to try to meet in person we get together twice a month on Zoom.

To be honest I was skeptical about how this was going to work but have found it to be very beneficial. As clergy, we encourage each other, pray for one another, discuss ministry ideas and offer knowledge and experience. In the spirit of collaboration, Pastor Cory Allard and I are going to do a "pulpit swap." We will each plan the worship service like we normally would but I will be preaching at her two churches and she will be preaching at ours. This will take place on the 21st. Make plans to join her on that Sunday.

Confirmation is another area where we will be collaborating. I invite any 7th and 8th graders to join us this fall for confirmation along with any older students who have not yet been confirmed. Please let me know if your student will be a part of this confirmation class. There will be a parents' meeting in September, more details to come.

Informational Meeting about Asbury's Parsonage: Raze or Repair/Renovate? We Need Your Input!

Dear Members of Asbury UMC,

As a member of Asbury United Methodist Church, you are invited to attend an important informational meeting on Sunday, August 28 to learn about options for either razing or renovating the current parsonage at 105 E. Main St. in Lake Mills. The parsonage has been rental property for many years, but is in need of numerous repairs before any new tenant can move in.

In June, the church received a letter from the City of Lake Mills stating the need for repairs to be completed in order not to be cited under city code. The repairs included siding on the west side of both the parsonage and the garage. Now is the time to consider other repairs and renovations needed. These include replacing several windows, new shingles on the main structure, and work on the south-facing front porch. Additional repairs and updates to the interior also need to be considered. The "Parsonage Repair & Maintenance" savings account has a current balance of \$30,770. This money will be used towards repair/ an renovate, or be used for demolition costs.

According to standards set by the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, the house does not meet accessibility standards and is not considered suitable as a residence for a pastor and family, but may be used as rental property. However, sale of the parsonage requires input for the UMC Conference and has stipulations on the use of any proceeds. This meeting will provide opportunities for those in attendance to ask questions and provide input so the Trustees can make a recommendation to Asbury's Ad. Council and a vote is determined on how to proceed.

Information to be shared include:

- verbal quotes for tearing down the structure
- potential costs for repairs (estimates only)
- current rental income
- possible future rental income if parsonage is renovate
- guidelines and restrictions on a 'sale' of the parsonage

Asbury's Board of Trustees and the Ad. Council would like to hear your thoughts and opinions about the future of the parsonage. Based on your input as a member of Asbury, your ideas and opinions are crucial for how to proceed. Please make an attempt to attend church services on Sunday, August 28 at 9:00 AM so that you are informed and your voice may be heard at the meeting immediately following church services.
