From the President's Desk

Fraters with this copy of The Bond I would like to bring you an update and reminder of the very important topics shared in our May 2012 copy. I have summarized these points below:

Membership, this is our lifeblood and is our first priority to prove, to decide what kind of alumni association we will be. We have over 1,300+ members in our chapter and as a result the decision was made to launch a firm goal of achieving 200 dues paying members in 2012. Will this membership total be achieved because of one man or group of men? No, this takes each and every one of us pushing, pulling, calling, emailing, texting or other means of communications to encourage our fraters to support the alumni association in this very basic fundamental effort of paying \$35 per year. If a frater is concerned about paying the \$35, please encourage them to attend just 1-event and they will receive their \$35 back in good food, drink and discussion.

Accountability, we see fraters as being accountable on 3 levels and those are broken down into stages. For summary purposes here I see us as having (3) levels of alumni: (See May 2012 The Bond for full explanation)

Level 1 – Alumni (Basic Frater)

Basic is not a negative because not all alumni can or wish to dedicate time as a volunteer but all alumni have the accountability to support TKE by providing input to the direction of the chapter, providing feedback to the leadership (both positive and constructive criticism) and by paying the annual dues.

Level 2 – Alumni Volunteer (Apollo Frater)

Under our new approach this will change by distributing duties across the larger base to prevent those alumni who elect to donate their time will not be over burdened with responsibility.

Level 3 - Alumni Leader (Fraternity for Life Frater)

This level of alumni dedication is not for all and does in fact require a specific passion and commitment to the fraternity as often daily, weekly and monthly obligations are required to help facilitate planning, executing events and ensuring the goals of the current year are met in order that we are prepared to begin next year's goals.

Frater Spotlight

Frater Sets Sights On Washington DC

Frater Scott Ellington, #1002, is currently running for the U.S House of Representatives, AR-Dist. 1, which covers the eastern third of AR from the MO to LA borders.



Scott pledged Beta-Psi in the Fall of 1982. He is a 1982 graduate of Brookland (AR) H.S &

graduated from ASU in 1987 with an Agriculture degree. He taught horticulture at the Vo-Tech level in Russellville briefly before entering law school at UA School of Law earning his JD in 1992.

He entered practice at El Dorado for 2 years then Batesville for 4 years before returning to Jonesboro in 1999 to be near his aging parents.

He is married to Tonya Bryant, formerly of Paragould. He has a son, Jack Ellington, who is a sophomore at ASU. He & Tonya also have a daughter, Jordan McBride, who serves in the US Army at Ft. Carson in Colorado Springs, CO and a son, Bradley McBride, who will be a Sr at Valley View in Jonesboro this fall.

Scott practiced law in Jonesboro for several years before joining the Prosecutor's Office in 2007. In 2010, he was elected as Prosecuting Attorney, a position he holds today.

Frater Ellington's elected position immediately took the media & legal spotlight & he says he really leaned on his experiences as a TKE undergraduate.

Scott says he still credits his pledge experience as teaching him endurance being steadfast. He can still recall Greg "Pro" Cole giving those motivating speeches about "making it through a situation." He said "if [I] could make it through 3 Fires & the "final" week of pledging, I could make it through most anything."

Only 2 days after being sworn in as Prosecuting Attorney on Jan 1, 2011, he dealt with a case where two police officers were shot & killed in the line of duty in West Memphis, AR.

In April, 2011, Officer Jonathon Schmidt, of the Trumann Police Dept., was killed during a routine traffic accident. Just last month, July, 2012, Frater Ellington successfully garnered a Capital Murder conviction and the death penalty for the assailant. "It was a tough decision to seek the death penalty against another person, he added, but it was the right thing in this case."

His most prominent professional accolade was his August, 2012, resolution of the nationally-acclaimed "West Memphis 3" case. He said he had to act in the best interest of the state of AR in a very tough situation.

He says he rarely goes a week – whether in work or campaigning – that he doesn't meet a frater. He regularly sees Frater Larry Williams (AGFC).



Scott says he learned through TKE accomplishments that "so much of life is just hanging in till the end." He will surely be using this position in campaigning for a spot in our nation's Capital.

He jokingly told his sons when they were pledging other fraternities to "just hang in....they can't eat you" as they endured their pledge trials. That is quite a poignant statement coming from a man who works in and around lawyers for a living, huh!
