## Spring 2014 Grant Awards

### 21st Century Technology - Fab Lab

Students will learn to identify needs in their community and invent solutions by developing designs and creating products utilizing technology, software, and 21st Century manufacturing processes. Students will also learn business/entrepreneurial aspects of running a business by applying business skills and strategies to market the products to consumers. The funding from this grant will be used to acquire a new vinyl printer and cutter. This new device would be used in the Fab Lab for various student-centered projects.

### 6th Grade Science Lab Equipment

The sixth grade science lab will use this equipment for their final unit, which involves Energy, Waves, Sound, Light, and the Electromagnetic Spectrum. These topics are very broad and cover a huge chunk of the Physics needed for the Science MCA. Hands on learning are invaluable to student learning, especially in science. Students need to see it, touch it, and experiment with the topics in order to truly have an understanding on the science involved.

### Green Ribbon Community Garden

In conjunction with PLSAS E-STEM and Green Ribbon School designations, the staff would like to build an outdoor classroom. This project consists of installing a vegetable garden and orchard at PLHS. The goal is to provide a scientific learning environment by planting, growing, and harvesting food. All successfully grown food will be used by PLHS in the school kitchen, food labs, or donated to charity.

### **Snowshoes for PLHS Physical Education Department**

This grant will add 10 pairs of snowshoes to the high school's 32 pairs. This would enable all students in the class to participate in a snowshoeing activity.

### Foreign Language Media

Current foreign language students do not have access to the extensive foreign language media available at Prior Lake High School. A region free DVD player will allow students to view DVD movies from countries other than the United States and Canada. It will also allow other programs to use the technology to show DVD's from other countries.

### Do you wonder how grant awards are decided? Read on...

The spring grant cycle has come to a close and a multitude of grant requests have been received from school district staff and the community. The hard part is deciding on how to allocate the funds set aside to grant those requests.

After the foundation budget has been approved for the year, the foundation board allocates a realistic dollar figure for each grant cycle (fall & spring). Once the grant deadline has come and gone, a board sub-committee (grant review commit-tee) reviews all of the applications received and uses a matrix of predefined criteria. Funds are limited and requests are in abundance.

The grant review committee brings their recommendations to a regular meeting of the foundation's board of directors. The board looks at each recommendation and either approves or asks for further documentation. Once all questions are answered and the board has given their approval, members of the foundation travel to each school with an award letter and certificate. It is gratifying to see the surprised look on the faces of the deserving staff & students.

## **Featured Grant**

The following is just one example of how our Foundation gives back to the students in the community.

### "Audiobooks of Newbery Titles"

Heather Zehnder, Special Education Teacher at Jeffers Pond was recently awarded this grant.

### Brief Description of Newbery Titles

The John Newbery Medal is a literary award given by the Association for Library Service to Children. The award is given to the author of "the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children." Named for John Newbery, an 18th-century English publisher of juvenile books, the Newbery was proposed by Frederic G. Melcher in 1921, making it the first children's book award in the world. The Newbery and the Caldecott Medal are considered the two most prestigious awards for children's literature in the United States. When the winner is announced each January, bookstores sell out, libraries order copies and teachers add the book to their lesson plans.

### Summary of the Grant Request

The project will be implemented with 5th grade students receiving special education services. The students will be given the opportunity to read the books at given times at school and also bring the books home to read. The students are required to complete six Newbery projects a year. They will check out a new book each time a Newbery project is assigned. I would like to expand this project in the future to allow other 5th grade students who struggle with reading to access the books as well.





Comments from Special Education Teacher Zehnder:

"Audiobooks are perfect for students who struggle to read to access quality literature. By listening to audiobooks, students are able to comprehend Newbery books. This also gives them the opportunity to increase their fluency and to read the same books as their peers. I have a student with an emotional/ behavioral disorder who also has a learning disability in reading. After bringing the audiobook home, he came in to tell me all about the story. I've never seen him so excited to read! I overheard another student say he was going to read his book in the car on a two hour road trip.

These types of comments I have never heard from my students before. In addition, the students are staying more engaged in reading tasks while at school and are asking when they can work on their Newbery books."

Comments from Jeffers Pond Principal Warner: "The Newbery books are excellent literature samples for students, but are not always easy to read for some of our special needs students. Using audiobooks as an alternative allows for students to be independent in their reading, much like their peers. This independence builds motivation and allows students to truly gain more meaning and understanding of high quality literature. We are excited for the opportunities of the project and truly appreciate your thoughtful consideration of this grant."
