SATURDAY 25 FEBRUARY

DEPART THE VILLAGE INN AT 10AM - RETURNING APPROX 3-4PM



Our drive today is on the SOUTHERN SCENIC ROUTE.

This will take you via Manapouri on the backroad route towards Invercargill. A full route map will be sent later – obviously we are just doing a part of the Route and before Invercargill, we will take an inland route back to Te Anau.

Take a drive on one of NZ's remote open roads, with stunning views and amazing ocean vistas on the coast.

We are working on organizing a picnic lunch option at Riverton Heads – we will advise details later, including cost.

There are still things to do, places to see

DOUBTFUL SOUND

If you've been to Milford Sound and think you don't need to do Doubtful Sound, think again!



Doubtful Sound is 10 x larger than Milford Sound and the trip is just as beautiful but quite different to the route to Milford.

A boat leaves from Manapouri Harbour and takes you over Lake Manapouri to West Arm where you will board a coach for the 40min stunning drive over the Southern Alpes, dropping down to Deep Cove to meet your boat to do either a 3 hour day cruise or start your overnight trip.

There are a couple of options for Doubtful, a Day Cruise or an Overnight Cruise.

RealNZ is the only day cruise operator and I know that bookings are already strong for January/February next year. RealNZ are also the only company that do the 1 night overnight trip, and again, bookings are filling fast but both trips are worth every penny.

(I'm not biased, but I have managed all these tourist activities in both Doubtful and Milford Sounds and if you have the time and the money, don't miss out on one of the last fantastically remote locations in the world!).

Departures times are:

DAY CRUISE – 10am the boat departs Manapouri, returning at 5.30pm

OVERNIGHT CRUISE – Departs at 12.30pm returning the same time the next day.

If you want to book either of these trips, please do this directly with RealNZ ASAP (or any other company/option you choose) at <u>www.realnz.com</u> as it is much easier if you manage your own bookings.

And if you do the Day Cruise, you might want to book a 4th night at The Village Inn, so please let me know if you want me to extend your 3 night stay to 4 nights and I will advise The Village Inn.
