

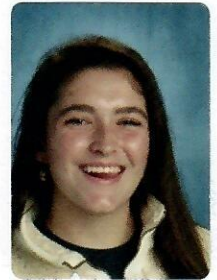

I hope they didn’t eat their candy all at once! We will continue to work through our Valentine’s day activities this week including sorting, and graphing hearts by size, shape and color. We celebrated our 100th day of school on Thursday. We strung fruit loops to make a necklace, we made a 100-day crown and we had a 100th day snack! 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**Kind:** Happy Valentine’s Day! I hope everyone had a great weekend. This week’s unit is Kindness. We will be reading a couple of stories, but our main read-aloud this week is Each Kindness by Jacqueline Woodson. We will discuss what the theme is, and what authors are trying to teach us by using that theme. In Math this week we will be working on finding the missing piece in a pattern, identifying the shortest and longest, and continuing with counting by tens using dimes. We will work on /oi/, /ue/, and /er/. Have a great week! - Mrs. Stewart  
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**1st/2nd:** This week we will be finishing up some Valentine’s Day projects. I also hope to finish nouns, verbs, and adjectives this week. We will also be working with compound words in both classes. Second grade will be working hard on past tense, present tense, and future tenses in writing. First grade will begin a science unit on sound and movement and second grade will begin their unit on properties of matter. Students will have spelling tests on Friday and several have AR tests due. Remember, if these are not finished by March 11<sup>th</sup>, students will stay in from recess until they finish all 5 tests. Finally, please remember to practice math facts and spelling bee words each night and over the long weekend. Have a great week! - Mrs. Hird  
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**3rd/4th:** Happy Valentine's Day! Last week most of the class finished our Map practice tests. Third grade will have a math test on Thursday this week. A study guide for chapter 11 in Science should come home tonight with fourth graders. They will have a test over this chapter on Thursday. Both third and fourth grade will have a test over their MO Studies Weekly week 13 on Friday. Students will have study guides to prepare them for this test as well. This week in Spelling, in addition to the normal spelling words, students will have 10 additional spelling bee words that they will be tested over. This is for a grade. I will be giving these out weekly until the spelling bee. The top two students from each grade will then go to participate in the Spelling Bee in May. Spelling bee list words have already gone home. Please be on the lookout for them. Our class is still working on mastering our math facts. Please study nightly with your students. If they have mastered their multiplication facts, they will move on to division. Should you have any questions, please let me know. - Mrs. Cooper

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**5th/6th:** 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will be working on their poems in writing this week. In Science, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will read about simple machines and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will finish Ch. 2 and test early next week. In Reading, students will work in their C.A.R.S. and Buckledown workbooks. They will also present their book reports to the class on Friday. In Social Studies, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will finish Ch. 3 about the causes of the Civil War and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will continue reading about ancient Mesopotamia.

**7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will begin a new figurative language unit and will present their "Sell This Book" reports on Thursday and Friday. Have a great week! - Mrs. Foster

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**5/6 Math:** In fifth grade, students are working with fraction operations, weight and mass conversions, and simplifying exponents. In sixth grade, students are working with expanded notation, operations involving units, and getting introduced to functions. **Tests This Week: 6th Math: Tuesday**

**7th/8th:** In math, seventh grade is working with coefficient rules with equations, graphs involving function story problems, and signed number evaluations. In pre-algebra, we will continue to encounter different types of equations, evaluating exponential expressions, and look at like algebraic terms. In algebra, we are working on factoring trinomials, volume of pyramids and cones, and the role of designated order in probability.
