1st/2nd: With this being a short week, we will be busy in the classroom trying to tie up loose ends before spring break. First grade, will be having a science test on Thursday over plant and animal adaptations. Be watching for the study guide to come home. They also have a review week in spelling which means 30 words. So, please study nightly. Spelling tests on Thursday this week. In addition, we are working hard on writing sentences correctly using capitalization, punctuation and correct word order. Second grade will have a reading test on Tuesday over the story we have been reading and their vocabulary cards. Second grade has been working on verbs and nouns and will have a verb test on Wednesday. In addition, second grade is beginning a unit on animals and we will be discussing different animals and how they adapt to their environments. In social studies, second grade will be discussing the Indians and how the Indians and the Pilgrims worked together. Even though it is a short week, we are working hard in class. 3rd/4th: This week our class will be working hard to get to a good stopping point for spring break. In spelling, it is a review week. The students have already studied the words, so I plan to test on Thursday. Third grade will have a math test on Tuesday and fourth grade will have theirs on Thursday. Both classes will have a social studies test on Wednesday over chapter 5. We had our ice cream party on Friday for meeting our goal for multiplication facts. Now students will

5th/6th: Book Its are due March 31. Both classes are working in C.A.R.S. and Buckledown, which will help them when taking MAP tests. 6th grade has a Science test over Chapter 3 on Thursday and their study over Egypt will continue. 5th grade is reading about the Underground Railroad in Social Studies. Their President posters looked great! 7/8th continue the unit in poetry this week. Students did a great job on Friday with their oral presentations on a chosen poet. C.A.R.S., Buckledown and Literature book selections will be the focus again this week. Students read passages and answered questions, proving their answers by underlining sentences in the text. – Mrs. Sewell

5th-8th Math: In 5th grade, students are looking at various unit conversions and exponents. In sixth grade, students are practicing the use of diagrams to answer part/whole questions and recognizing stated and unstated information. In seventh grade, students are looking at transformations with the use of the coordinate plane and learning to bisect angles. In pre-algebra, students are learning about the trichotomy axiom and symbols of negation. In algebra, students are continuing to factor different types of expressions and do the various operations on numbers in scientific notation.

Tests This Week: 5th Math: Thursday, 6th Math: Thursday, Pre-Algebra: Thursday, 5-8 Math Vocabulary Test on Tuesday 7th-8th: In science, we are back in our respective units. Seventh grade will conclude their astronomy unit with a chapter about space exploration. Eighth grade will conclude their heredity unit with a chapter about the various geologic areas. In social studies, we have concluded our unit on the constitution. Seventh grade is moving on to learning about the Industrial Revolutions that occurred both in Europe and the United States. Eighth grade is learning about the forced migrations of various native American groups in the first half of the 19th century.
