THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The baptism of Jesus reminds us of our own baptism. There are many offices that people can hold in the Church. But all of these pale when compared to the basic gift to all – Baptism. Our dignity before God depends on one thing only, and that is, the extent to which we have lived out our baptismal calling. The ceremony of baptism is a beautiful one. In it we were formally given a name and welcomed into the family of God's people. Prayers were said over us. Our body was signed with the sign of the cross, the mark of Christ's love for us. Water, which is a symbol of cleansing, was poured over us as we are cleansed of sin. However, it is especially a symbol of life, as in baptism we are given a share in the divine life of God. And so, through baptism we share in the Lord's ministry as we follow His way:

> Lord Jesus, touch our feet so that we may walk in your paths. Touch our minds so that we may understand your ways. Touch our hearts so that we may bring your love

..... to our brothers and sisters. Amen.
