ANZAC Day

What a fantastic turn out from the approximately 600 people of Tyabb and surrounds. I personally knew of people coming from Mornington and Langwarrin. A big thanks goes to Peter Davis and his team who coordinated the event and made it a very enjoyable and moving morning. More later in the newsletter.

Around Town



Continuing from the last newsletter, the Shire has commenced work on the Youth (Guide) Hall and it appears that it may be a little more involved than first expected. This work has now come to a halt due to further discussions concerning the restoration works. The Guides are unable to use the hall for a time while the restoration works continue. The Guides will meet with the Shire soon to discuss the hall repairs. From initial discussions it looks like it will be a very expensive exercise. Thank you again to Pastor Rod Whitford and his congregation for coming to the Guides' assistance and giving them space in which to continue their meetings.

It would be most upsetting if the hall was demolished; it is such a part of the history of Tyabb; local families donated the land on which it now stands and also organised its transfer from its initial position in town.

Most of you by now will have noticed the safety/security fencing out the front of the Tyabb Antiques store adjacent to the Post Office. Last Friday, 31st May, there was a two car accident, where the two came together with one mounting the footpath and knocking down a couple of the verandah support posts. How could they come together? Perhaps the drivers were just not paying attention whilst in control of a vehicle. It's left a mess though.

Discussions between Neale Burgess and Vic Rail/Metro are still ongoing at this stage; which is a good thing.

Tyabb Placemaking is still being discussed with the Shire and various projects are being addressed such as relocating the 'Tyabb Packing House' sign adjacent to the United servo so that traffic does not turn down Dalton Drive or Dennis Street but is directed to turn at Mornington Tyabb Road and lifting the blue car parking sign in the centre medium so that the wording can actually be seen.

Olivers Creek

Regarding the remediation of the Olivers Creek Reserve (along Mornington Tyabb Road beside the primary school) there is gathering interest. I have heard from various people that there is a feeling that in conjunction with such a project, serious consideration must be given to the creation of a REAL car park for the primary school. Let's remember that projects such as this have a huge benefit for the whole community; so let's hear from those who wish to get involved (phone or email the Ratepayers Group). Remember, many hands make light work.

Tyabb Airfield

As you may have learned, the Peninsula Aero Club Ltd withdrew their applications to remove the Sunday morning 9:30am - 10:30am curfew and to widen the sealed runway.

The withdrawal came at very short notice, immediately before the applications were to be considered by the Council's Planning Services committee meeting on 20th May. It appears that the PAC Ltd were unhappy with the conditions the Shire planners recommended should be attached to the permits. In all cases these conditions were that the PAC Ltd were to produce an Airfield Master Plan and a Noise Management Plan for Council approval within a finite timeframe. The need for these plans was identified as part of the Tyabb Airfield Precinct Plan implementation process as approved by Council in December 2017.

Following the withdrawal of their applications the PAC Ltd has resubmitted them under a different planning mechanism known as 'secondary consent'.

According to the Western Port News the PAC Ltd would use a refusal as a "trigger to bypass the Shire and seek a ruling from the Victorian Civil & Administrative Tribunal."

At this time our representatives are waiting to hear the date for the next CRG meeting.

What is Snap Send Solve?

Like all great ideas, Snap Send Solve was developed from a simple thought - "wouldn't it be great if I could report this broken swing in the park through an app".

The result has been a robust, user focused, mobile app that takes all the thinking out of reporting to local authorities.

The premise is simple: the app works out where you are, who manages incidents within that particular area and then using a users own email address sends through relevant information such as location, incident type and any related image to the correct contact.

The best part? Users don't have to wait in phone queues, pass on any additional personal information, if they don't wish, and the same app can be used anywhere in Australia - no need to download an app every time you travel across the country.

After being available to download for a number of years and receiving an increasing amount of feedback from users, Snap Send Solve was redeveloped so that it could similarly work in conjunction with Water, Gas and Electricity companies, Asset Management bodies and a number of other organisations who want to be a part of Australia's most used incident reporting app.

Today, Snap Send Solve allows users to report incidents to every single council in Australia as well as a growing list of new organisations.



To start using this service just download it from your app store. Once you have made a report to Council or whoever they will reply with a case number. It's a great idea and works so well.

You can download it direct to your phone from the AppStore or Google Play.

ANZAC Day Commemorative Service 2019



Strong contingents from the Tyabb Football and Netball club and the Tyabb CFA set the scene for another well attended Tyabb Dawn Service.

An estimated crowd of around 600 were treated kindly by the weather whilst paying their respects to all service personnel both past and present.

More than 100 years of nursing was the RSL program focus and our own Annie Sage was remembered for her contribution to the armed services and the nation.

The ever increasing participation and attendance of the schools, and the young in general, was acknowledged by Master of Ceremony, Hastings RSL Vice President Bruce (Boof) Dollisson with his encouragement of the young to be the custodians of the ANZAC legend and spirit.

Somerville Tyabb Rotary and 1st Tyabb scouts again cooked a fine breakfast of eggs and bacon and during this time many old friends and neighbours were able to catch up on this annual special occasion firmly embedded in the national identity and local calendar.

Pastor Rod Whitford and the four girl choir gave guidance in prayer and the anthems.

A moving reading of "the requiem" and a fine commemorative address rounded out the service.

The influence of the schools in teaching awareness of the tradition and their enthusiastic participation every year cannot be underestimated as a catalyst for the ever increasing attendance of the young.

"The enthusiasm of staff and students from our four primary and secondary schools and the service organisations is infectious and makes the job of coordination a pleasure", said the organisers.

Hasting Police represented by Sergeant Phil Weight and Sergeant Ben Swift were part of the community, helping to keep the traditions of true service alive and thriving.

The Shire Emergency Management Officer (Fletch) representing the Council, was given further tasks when a fainting attack overcame two people. The CFA, Scouts and Fletch were quickly in attendance to minister first aid and the organisers are indebted to the skills of these first aiders in handling that situation with assistance from the CFA first aid equipment on site. Fortunately, both patients recovered quickly.
