1st/2nd: Thank you to all my parents for participating in conferences yesterday. This week 2nd grade will continue working on cursive handwriting, telling time, and counting money. Make sure you are practicing those math facts at home. We will also begin discussing character changes in stories as we read "The Diary of a Spider". First grade is continuing to talk about what makes a complete sentence and we are still working on handwriting as well. We will also be working more on our word families and phonetic awareness. And like second grade, first grade needs to be practicing their math facts. Both classes will begin talking about what makes a "good citizen" and will be working on memorizing our addresses and phone numbers. We will have our Halloween party on Friday to end the week. 3rd/4th: We have successfully completed the first quarter and are moving full steam ahead into the second quarter. It was nice to connect with all of you about the progress of your student. We are learning

about helping, linking, and being verbs. Students are using them correctly in sentences. We are also working on our math facts. Speed and accuracy are vital to building the proper math foundation that our students will use in the rest of their academic careers. 5th/6th: Happy Red Ribbon Week! In Science, 5th graders will test over Ch. 16 on Wednesday and 6th graders will test over Ch. 1 on Thursday. In English, both grades will be looking at direct objects and past, present, and future tense. In Lit. Circle, both grades will be reading Ch. 3 & 4 in "Number the Stars" and will present roles on Friday. In Social Studies, 5th and 6th graders will have a test over the Presidential Election on Friday. **2nd Quarter AR Book Requirements:** 5th-8th grade students will need to read two books, keep a reading log, and pass a test over each with at least an 8/10 by Mon. December 14th. **7th/8th Comm. Arts:** We are finally ready to start reading "The Diary of Anne Frank"! Students will be doing journal activities and will complete roles to present to the class over each section. Have a great week! - Mrs. Foster

5th-8th Math: Fifth grade is working on division with remainders, recognizing fractions equal to one half to help with reducing fractions, and the associative property. Sixth grade is working with story problems dealing with part/whole relationships, ratio, and multiples. Seventh grade is working on compasses and inscribed circles and prime factorizations to reduce fractions. Eighth grade is working on multiple unit multipliers, using average in word problems, and the relationship among fractions, decimals, and percents. **5th and 6th will have a math test Thursday.**

7th/8th: I enjoyed the opportunity to visit with the parents of students on Monday. Seventh grade dioramas were enjoyable to see, and I can see the work that was put into them. Thank you for supporting those efforts. Seventh grade will be starting a chapter in social studies which deals with ancient Greece, and eighth grade will be moving ever closer to the American Revolution. **Tests this Week: 7th Math: Friday, 8th Math: Wednesday, Algebra: Wednesday - Mr. Ewing**
