From the Pastor's Desk

CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

As many of you know there is a book that I love very dearly called "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23". It is a very interesting book that explains Psalm 23 in a new light. The author, Phillip Keller, was a shepherd (in the real full sense) in Africa and later studied theology. He was amazed when reading Psalm 23 how it made sense for him what God was doing as described by the psalm to His sheep. Today, as we read the Gospel of the Good Shepherd, I want to focus on something that Keller said, the shepherd knows his sheep. It is interesting that shepherds in the time of Jesus and even today in certain parts of Africa and Asia, are not literate and have not much education. However, they know their flock and they know if one is missing. Each sheep gets a name, and each sheep recognizes the voice of the shepherd. This is the good news of this Gospel, we are not alone, God knows us and calls us to be with him. Let me explain a bit further, one of the things that I dislike the most is to arrive to a meeting or gathering where I do not know anyone. I feel that I do not belong and like fish out of water. However, as soon as I find a familiar face or I get called by someone who knows me, then everything changes. It is exactly what this Gospel is saying. God is calling us, telling us we are NOT alone, God is calling us to belong to his sheepfold and thus be taken care by Him. WE ARE NOT ORPHANS! WE HAVE A FATHER IN HEAVEN!

Also, we are in full gear to enter into May, we will have the May Crowning, First Communions, Food Truck Festival. We need your support with the 50/50 Raffle that was mailed to you and if you can buy more even better. All you do is a blessing to the parish. 
