We kept saying, "The stuff we talk about in here, it all about making a difference out there."

Every week we talked about what was going on at school. In the confirmation class, there were students from four different school districts, each on a different and evolving schedule. We would "check-in" and say prayers for the kids. It felt so good to share our stories and experiences. Myself included!

It is my prayer that these kids always remember our time together, as a time of wonder, mystery, connection and inclusion. I also pray that what has been planted in their hearts will flourish and produce an abundance of love for the world...

And that's really what life is all about. Being the church, is all about making a difference for the sake of the world. We gather to worship; we are then sent to "Go in Peace and Serve the Lord…"

This past year we have weathered tremendous challenges. And the remarkable thing has not only been our resiliency, but I've also sensed a renewed mission. Our mission statement seems more poignant to me.

I've had numerous conversations with people about how good it feels to be back in church. I've also had numerous conversations with people about the worship videos. We had neighbors watching the worship videos, neighbors who belong to other churches... We had our members send the links to others around the country, and in one case, around the world...

As we emerge from this covid conundrum, and get back to some kind of normal, I wonder how that "normal" will look?

I image worship will slowly go back to normal. And maybe we've learned that shorter is alright... And for some people, even preferred! And we've also learned, that for some people, connecting with the congregation through watching a worship video also works.

We might have accidentally discovered new ways of worship that are welcoming, inviting and meaningful. I imagine this will continue to be discussed in the upcoming months. And something we should prayerfully consider.

And I welcome your input. Please feel free to tell me what you think, and how you have experienced "church" this past year. We are, very much, in a unique position as we move forward. And guided by the Spirit, we will be a new creation. However, that happens...

Cannon River Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 13, 2021

The Cannon River Lutheran Church Council met on May 13, 2021, at Cannon River Lutheran Church. Present were Deacon Todd Portinga, Bill Bodin, David Fremouw, Mark Hartman, Shawn Klahr and Sharon Niebur. Absent: Michelle Sandeen

Meeting was called to order by President, Bill Bodin

Deacon Todd led us in devotions.

Minutes from the March 18, 2021 were read. Motion made by David Fremouw, second by Mark Hartman to approve the March 18, 2021 minutes.

Treasurer's report for the month of March was read. Motion by Mark Hartman, second by David Fremouw to approve the March treasurer's report. The April treasurer's report was not available at this meeting, so will be reviewed at a later time.

Old Business:

All in attendance agreed that the new shingles on the church building and dining hall look great.

Simon Construction did an outstanding job. The Building Inspector says all looks good. The inspection fee was \$186.

Bill has inspected the frames around the stained glass windows. He feels they will probably need to be caulked in the near future to keep them in good condition. We will be looking into the possibility of some type of maintenance free frames.

Our discussion continued about the replacement of the wooden steps on the southwest corner of the church. Precast cement steps were discussed as a possible good solution. No decisions were made.

A donation of \$833 was made to the Cannon Falls Food Shelf at the completion of the March Food Share Campaign.

Sargent's Nursery was hired to clean out and refresh the mulch in our garden this spring. We all agreed they did a nice job.

New Business:

Because Governor Walz has ended his state mask mandate, it was decided to not require that masks be worn in our church building. It was also decided to have communion and offering go back to the pre-covid format. All changes will be based on the new guidelines. Deacon Todd will be calling some of his colleagues to see how they are handling singing in their congregations.

The goal is to slowly resume normal worship. Deacon Todd feels that our on-line worship has filled the gap that appeared when we weren't able to have in-person worship. It was found to extend the reach of worship beyond our community. He is anticipating during the summer the on-line worship video will become smaller and more concise.

June 13th will be our Graduation Recognition. We will be recognizing four graduates.



The agenda was approved, with the addition of Synod Assembly review under new business. The April meeting minutes were approved as written.

Janet will work with Deanna in applying for a grant though the ELCA to help promote "Open Doors", this funding if for a specific and actionable idea for how its ministry might meet new people while we consider this time of transition and regather in community as COVID-19 considerations allow. It was suggested to use the monies, if granted, for a camera for the Church and the banners that were already purchased. Janet was thinking of planning an open house come fall to welcome current and possible new members into the church, in which the funding can help with that as well.

The meeting was adjourned, and the Lord's Prayer was said.

2021 SE Synod Assembly Recap

The theme was Leading Together and Everlasting Faithfulness. Last year's Synod Assembly was cancelled due to COVID-19. Deacon Todd and Janet Daley attended with 350 people on Saturday May 8th by Zoom.

As an assembly of congregations, we gathered together to worship, learn, and participate in the decision-making business of the church. Bishop Regina Hassanally (from St. Luke's in Goodhue) was the MC.

There was the typical election of council, boards & committees with no additional nominations from the floor. All names on the ballot were unanimously voted in. Just like what happens at our annual meeting! All resolutions were passed via Zoom voting.

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod is a faith community of 167 congregations and six Synod Authorized Worshipping Communities, as well as related institutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The Southeastern Minnesota Synod is one of 65 synods that make up the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Its geographic area includes 15 counties in the southeastern corner of Minnesota. The synod is divided into five conferences, each one named after rivers in the area.

- 5 Cannon River Conference

There were no breakout sessions which typically brought opportunities for relationship-building that come with face-toface interactions.

Words from Bishop Regina Hassanally:

Yet despite the challenges and losses we have all experienced this past year, God has shown us new ways to create and maintain God's beloved community – reaching out with compassion and sharing the love of Jesus. Perhaps most of all we have seen God's faithfulness through the tireless commitment of others within our church and our communities, all of them essential workers in God's kingdom. This has been a year of challenges few of us had the ability to imagine just two years ago. Through each difficulty, restriction and point of tension Jesus has remained a constant presence, the Spirit has continued to breathe inspiration, God has sustained us faithfully. We can scarcely begin to imagine what the next year might bring. Yet, we move forward knowing full well the faithfulness of God is everlasting.
