Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began.

"I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They

O Jesus, pray for us.


We are as sure of your prayers as we are that the sun will rise tomorrow. So we ask for understanding and knowledge and courage and wisdom.

We ask that you be with us always till the end of our days. May your Spirit never leave us alone. Our roots need rain. Amen.






