



History

of the

W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Inc.

W. A. Pattillo Alumni Association was the vision of four individuals: Nathan Lewis, William Boyd, Rayfield Perkins, and George Worsley. Following a financially successful reunion in 1978, Nathan Lewis and members of the Class of 1955 agreed to donate the proceeds to organize an alumni association. Planning meetings were scheduled with Nathan, Rayfield and William encouraging other graduates to attend along with George contacting members of the classes of 1939, 1940, and 1941. The "vision" was taking shape and the participants established national alumni associations since many participants were from out-of-state, mainly Philadelphia, PA and Washington, DC.

In 1981, former students of the Tarboro Colored High School, the W.A. Pattillo High School and Princeville Elementary School gathered for the first reunion. The Tarboro Colored High School group had been informally organized in the late 1970s and this membership basically included the graduating classes of 1924 through 1943. Those involved with this group were Ethel Lewis, Helen Knight, William Ruffin, Grady Ashe, Elizabeth McMillian, Susanna Thomas, George Matthewson, Maude Bullock Porter, Lorna Pitt and others. The "plan" was in motion.

After the first reunion, more supporters came. They were Eunice Parker, Evelyn Faulk, Grace Swinson, Iris Braswell, Rev. James Wooten, Myrna Deloatch, Hubert Simmons, Charlie Brown, McMillan, Helen Newton Elizabeth Knight, George Matthewson, and Lois Cobb. The "dream" was taking shape. At this time, Nathan Lewis served as Interim National President and Iris Braswell was elected as the Tarboro Chapter President. In 1982, Alfred Norfleet was elected as the Washington, DC President and in 1983; Grady Ashe was elected as the Baltimore Chapter President.

In 1983, under the leadership of the President, Earlene Womack Lawrence, the alumni association obtained its state charter and was incorporated as the W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Incorporated. Charter members were Jimmie Bullock, Thomas Perry, Grady E. Ashe, Lorna Lloyd, Helen Knight, Iris Braswell, Cora Boddie and George Matthewson.


In 1985 the Tidewater Chapter was formed. The "vision" had become a reality. The past presidents have been Nathan Lewis, Jimmie Bullock, Barbara Bratcher Anderson, Earlene Knight Womack, Eva Norfleet, Thomas Newton, and Varnell Vines Kinnin. The association's current president is Fred S. Wood, Jr.

After a re-organization in July 2002, the purpose of the Association was revised, and according to its articles of incorporation, is to (1) provide scholarships, grants, etc. to students which the organization deems worthy of the same for purposes of assisting them in furthering their education; (2) provide financial and other assistance to educational institutions at all levels; (3) purchase books, equipment, etc. for the benefit and use of educational, social and civic organizations whose purposes or functions are related to promoting and enriching the lives of citizens; and, (4) promote and conduct social programs and events in communities for purposes of raising funds and promoting communications. Since the inception of the alumni association, approximately \$80,000 in scholarship funds have been awarded to area high school students to attend four-year colleges, community colleges and universities throughout the United States.

Under the present leadership of President Wood, the Officers and Board of Directors, the organization is forging into the 21st century in a concerted effort to promote and expand the focus of W. A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Inc. and to broaden its scope in the local, state and national communities.





Vivian Christine Pettaway Askew was born October 23, 1913 in Pitt County. She is the oldest of three children born to Alice and Albert Pettaway, with sisters Ethel Pettaway Lewis and Eva Green Pettaway. At the age of seven she moved with her family to Princeville to attend school. She completed the Princeville Grade School and in 1932 graduated from the Tarboro Colored High School with Mr. W. A. Pattillo as Principal.

Mrs. Askew is a 1950 graduate of Storer College, Harpers Ferry, West Virginia with a degree in Elementary Education. She retired in 1978 after having taught 28 years in two counties of the West Virginia Public School System.

She was married for 48 years to the late Eddie Askew, having made their home in Fairmont, West Virginia. A 50 year member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Fairmont, WV she served on the Hostess and Fundraising Committees at Trinity. She was honored as the oldest member of Trinity United Methodist in 2009 during their 137th Anniversary.


Mrs. Askew proudly holds affiliations in the Golden Membership of Alpha Kappa Alpha (AKA) Sorority, the National Council of Negro Women, Storer College (now Virginia Union University) Alumni Association and the W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association. Inc.

She has been honored as "Outstanding Educator" by Dunbar High School Alumni Association of Fairmont, was a 2005 Honoree at the "The Gay Nineties Ladies" Tea Sponsored by the Phoenix Society for African American Research and saluted in The Daily Southerner July 23, 2012 article written by the late C. Rudolph Knight entitled: "Oldest Living Graduate of the W.A. Pattillo School".

Mrs. Askew holds a milestone of being a Centennial. She celebrated her 100th Birthday on October 26, 2013 at Gateway to Heaven Church with family and friends from near and far. There were special acknowledgements from President Obama; Governor of West Virginia; Mayor of Fairmont, WV; Mayor of Tarboro, NC; W.A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association; AKA Sorority; and NBC TV correspondent Willard Scott.

A family oriented person, she is the aunt of Varnell Lewis Bridgers, Vivian C. Lewis Bazemore, Bessie M. Lewis, Alice F. Lewis Grant, and the late William (Mutt) H. Lewis, Jr, James Bridgers, Chester Bazemore and James Grant.; the great aunt of Cheneta Lewis Jones, Colette Bazemore, Nyisha Wooten, Kimberly Grant, Temeka G. Nichols, Latoya G. Whitehead, Darryl Bridgers, and Erik Bridgers, David Jones, Brody Whitehead, and Cody Nichols.

She has a daily quote that she reads: "Good Morning, I am God; I will handle all your affairs today; I do not need your help!"





Christopher Rudolph Knight was born May 2, 1947, the son of the late Christopher Columbus and Jetta Howard Knight. At age seven, Rudolph and his mother joined his father, a career U.S. Army paratrooper, at the newly integrated Ft. Campbell (KY) base. This was followed by sojourns at Ft. Benning (GA) and Ft. Bragg (NC). At age fourteen, he and his mother returned to Tarboro.

After graduating with honors from the W. A. Pattillo High School in 1965, Rudolph attended North Carolina Central University where he earned a BS degree in Business Administration in 1969. Following graduation from North Carolina Central University, he accepted a position with Edgecombe Community College where he was the school's first professional level African American employee. He taught business courses for seven years and was then the Director of Continuing Education for 21 years before retiring in 1997. During these years he continued his education, earning Master of Science degrees in Education Administration, Library Science, and Adult Education from East Carolina University. After working briefly for the Weldon City Schools, Rudolph enjoyed being the Historic Preservation Planner for the City of Rocky Mount for nine years before his "final" retirement in 2011.

Family and friends knew Rudolph to be kind, caring, loving, sensitive, and generous. Always quick to react to any perceived wrong or injustice, he returned respect for respect. Rudolph was the guru of Edgecombe County African American history who co-authored three books with his partner, Dr. Lawrence Auld. These were 1) From Water Street to East Tarboro, Keechtown, and The Depot: Tarboro African American Neighborhoods (2010); 2) The Education of a Generation: The Rosenwald Schools and Other African-American Schools in Edgecombe County, A Preliminary History (2012); and 3) African American Heritage Guide: Tarboro, Rocky Mount, Edgecombe County (November 2013). From 2003-2013 he wrote a column on local African American history for The Daily Southerner. Those columns sometimes involved Knight's detail research that discredited historic information that had been told for years. He also contributed to Welcome to Tarboro Homes magazine and the Rocky Mount Telegram.


Another significant feat Knight was proud of was the Perry-Weston Historical, Cultural, and Educational Institute, that was organized in 2008 by him, Dr. Florence Armstrong and Auld. The purpose of the organization lined up with his passion to promote African American history, genealogy, culture, and arts, in Edgecombe County and North Carolina.

A member of several community organizations, Rudolph was an instrument of change and progress in the W. A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Incorporated. In his position as Chairperson of the Archives Committee of the Association - a historian extraordinaire - he not only studied and wrote about the organization's past but made it relevant to our today. The members of the W. A. Pattillo High School National Alumni Association, Incorporated, recognize our Alumnus, Christopher Rudolph Knight for his faithful and dedicated service to the organization and its purposes.

Louis Belcher was a 1956 honor graduate of W. A. Pattillo High School. During his school career participated and excelled in the sports of tennis and basketball. He was awarded several basketball scholarships selecting to attend Saint Augustine College and graduated in 1963. Lou touts a stellar career in the corporate world that took him to many quarters of the United States. His resume reflects positions in sales, marketing, management training, program development, sports marketing and human resources development to list a few. Additionally, Lou has been an entrepreneur and also a member of the Saint Augustine College Board of trustees. He is married to Gloria Jean and they have two children Travis and Angela.



Alexander "Skeet" Davis, Jr. is a 1970 graduate of W.A. Pattillo High School. He was the oldest of five. Skeet played baseball as an outfielder for 3 years and football for 4 years. He was a viable member of W.A. Pattillo High School's State Championship Team in 1969. He was a member of all special teams and played wide receiver, defensive back and running back. He received the Best Sportsmanship Award in 1969. He was also Vice President of the Student Government. Skeet holds a bachelor and masters degrees from Fayetteville State University. During his tenure in the Kinston School System, he mentored thousands of young adults including numerous athletes who played college football and four who played professional football. Skeet is an active member of White Rock Presbyterian Church. He is married to Valeria and they have two daughters: Star and Jewel. He has one granddaughter Allaya.



Earl Miller is a native of Kinston, NC and a graduate of Adkin High School where he participated in football, baseball, basketball and tennis. He was an All-State running back who played in the East-West Shrine Bowl Football game during his senior year. Coach Miller is a US army Veteran with service in Vietnam; a 1963 graduate of North Carolina Central University in Durham; and a 2005 inductee in the NCCU Hall of Fame. He began teaching at Pattillo in August 1966; he taught General Science, Math, and Health and Physical Education. During his tenure as Head Football Coach and the coach of the J.V. Basketball team; the J. V. basketball team won three conference championships with a record of 69-3. The football team won the NCHSAC State Championship in 1969. They defeated Adkin High School in Kinston, N. C. coached by his brother. That was a great victory. Coach is a member and officer of Union Baptist Church; a community advocate; and married Mittie V. Bullock. They have one daughter, Dr. Monica E. Miller, who resides in Boston, Massachusetts.

Reginald A. Moss moved to Tarboro on August 12, 1961 with his family. He recalls that they were met by members of the W.A. Pattillo High School football team: Fred Wood, Clyde Cherry, Victor Spencer, Peter Lloyd Pitt, Artis Bryant, Joe Dunn, Donnie Smith, Fred Cherry, and a few others, who assisted them in moving. He taught Health and Physical Education, coached football and basketball, taught drivers education, and later served as a senior class sponsor. In subsequent years, he was Asst. Principal and varsity coach at Tarboro High. Coach Moss also served as: Transportation Coordinator for the State Board of Education DOT, Community Schools Coordinator of Tarboro City Schools, and Principal of Princeville and Stocks Elementary Schools. Coach Moss and his wife raised and educated 5 children, and retired in Tarboro. They decided long ago that Tarboro was home.



Dr. Clyde C. Pettaway is a 1962 graduate of the W. A. Pattillo High School. He played for four years in football and basketball and was a starter for his sophomore through senior years. He was the Co-captain of the foolball team his senior year. Upon graduation from Pattillo was awarded a full football scholarship to Florida A&M University. After the first year, Clyde transferred to NC A&T State University and upon eligibility earned LETTERMAN Club honors for all three of his playing years there. Clyde was selected seventh Future Draft Choice by the Houston Oilers his junior year at A&T, and drafted his senior year by the Atlanta Falcons.
