#### FROM THE DEACONS

We Christians are continuously striving for growth, and we know the foundation of our mature faith is the healing power of prayer. In addition, we know that we evolve in our faith with the support of other believers. In Colossians 4:2, we read: "Devote yourselves to prayer with an alert mind and a thankful heart... so we can make a difference where you have placed us."

Since May, every Tuesday evening during prayer service, our pastor has inspired us to understand more meaningful prayer and to achieve ultimate prayer experiences! These discussions and research on our own have led to spurts of prayer growth! Some notes are listed below. (These are only a few possibilities.)

- While praying, talk in everyday language throughout the day so that prayer is an integral part of our day. (I enjoy praying during the stops at red lights.)
- Some of us pray better with lists and requests and/or prayer journals. One example is spiritual healing prayers which exchange hurt for comfort.
- Post-Covid requires "newness" in our life, our church, and our community. "Father, I ask you for a fresh
  vision for what breakthrough would look like in our world. Forgive us for trying to fix ourselves. Your
  grace is sufficient to cover every broken place, every wound, and every heartache. Thank you for doing
  more than we can even imagine. Thank you for restoring every place of difficulty, every battle.....for your
  greater glory!."
- Read the Bible and pray over verses.
- Pray we will give our time, money and energy for God's Kingdom. This may include praying for our community, neighbors, and those seeking Jesus. We must pray that we love our enemies. A sample prayer: "Father, whether I am aware of it or not, I know there are people in my life I feel angry toward or hurt by them. Give me the humility I need to forgive them, love them, and pray for them without expecting or seeking anything in return."
- Pray for responsibility. Ask God to teach us how to withhold judgment on other people's actions.
- Pray for hope and kindness asking God to help in recognizing what can be controlled (attitude, responses, feelings) and what only God controls.
- Pray for courage, obedience, humility, purity. We want our words, thoughts, and actions to please God.
- Praise, thank, and remember God's love and grace for us.

We have our varied routine prayer practices. Actsl:14 tells us to join together in prayer and in James 5:16 we read: "Therefore, confess your sins.....and pray for each other so that we may be healed." Let's be intentional in prayer and watch for God's love in our life, our church and our community.
