DAY ONE (Day of Passover):

A Psalm of David. YAHWEH is my shepherd; I shall not lack. He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me to waters of rest. *Psalm 23:1-2*

DAY TWO:

Whoever loves instruction loves knowledge, but he who hates correction is like a brute animal. *Proverbs 12:1*

DAY THREE:

YAHWEH is good to those waiting on Him, to the soul seeking Him. *Lamentations 3:25*

DAY FOUR:

Let your garments be white every time; and let not oil lack upon your head. *Ecclesiastes 9:8*

DAY FIVE:

Seek YAHWEH and His strength, seek His face continually. 1st Chronicles 16:11

What is the Meaning of Passover?

YAHWEH has seven feasts to be kept each year. These feasts show YAHWEH's Plan for all mankind, and Yahshua, His Son. Passover is the first feast to be observed once each new year.

So, when is the Passover observed? Scripture tells us:

In the first month, on the fourteenth of the month, between the evenings is the Passover to YAHWEH. *Leviticus* 23:5

~ The First Passover ~

The very first Passover happened when the Israelites were still in Egypt. YAHWEH commanded each household to take the blood of a lamb or goat and put it on the doorposts of their home. This was the sign for the death angel to pass over their home so the firstborn would not die.

YAHWEH commanded them to eat a meal of lamb roasted with fire, unleavened bread and bitter herbs. While they ate, they needed to have their loins girded, their sandals on their feet and staffs in their hand. They were not to leave their home until morning or have any roasted lamb left over. If any lamb was left from the meal it would need to be burned with fire before morning.

The first Passover shows us how the Israelite's firstborn were saved from death through the shed blood of the lamb.

~ YAHSHUA, our Lamb ~

When Yahshua suffered and died **He** became the Passover Lamb sacrifice for the sins of **all mankind**. After His death, unleavened bread and wine became the new symbols to take at Passover **once a year**. The animal sacrifice at Passover was **no longer needed**. The unleavened bread represents His body and the wine represents His blood. These symbols are taken as a **memorial meal** to remind us of Yahshua's sacrifice and our covenant relationship with Him.



To Wash the Feet of Another...

Before Yahshua's death, at the time of Passover, He kneeled down and washed the feet of His disciples. He was showing them the need to wash the feet of a fellow brother who is also in covenant relationship. He said only the feet need to be washed and not the entire body. It was to teach us there is no need to be baptized again.

Each day we need to continue to fight against sin. Foot washing at Passover shows we are washing out the little spots and wrinkles in our lives. Yahshua taught we are all the same and no one is greater than the other. It is humble to wash the feet of another person and it shows us we need to serve one another!



He rose up from the supper and laid aside His garments. And taking a towel, He girded Himself. Then He put water into the basin and began to wash the feet of the disciples, and to wipe off with the towel with which He was girded.

The Passover Lamb


We no longer need to slay an additional lamb at Passover because Yahshua is The Passover Lamb!



The Passover Herb

During the first Passover in Egypt Yahweh commanded the Israelites to use **Hyssop** to spread the lamb's blood on the doorposts.

And take a bunch of **hyssop** and dip in the blood in the basin. And touch some of the blood in the basin to the lintel and on the two doorposts. And you shall not go out, anyone from the door of his house until morning – **Exodus 12:22**



Because it has a very strong smell and was also used for many medicinal purposes, including cleansing and purifying the body.



Purify me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow – Psalm 51:7

"And the priest shall go out to the outside of the camp. And the priest shall look; and, behold, if the plague of leprosy is healed in the leper, then the priest shall command, and he shall take for him who is to be cleansed two clean living birds, and cedar wood, and scarlet, and hyssop.... And he shall sprinkle on him who is to be cleansed from the leprosy seven times, and shall pronounce him clean.... *Leviticus 14:3-4; 7a*"

It was the only herb that was used with the sacrifice of the Red Heifer...

"For when the whole ordinance had been propounded by Moses to all the people, according to the Torah; Moses took the blood of a heifer, and water, with scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled upon the scrolls and upon all the people; saying, "This is the blood of the covenant which is ordained to you by YAHWEH"- *Hebrews 9:19-20*

"And the priest shall take cedar wood, and hyssop and scarlet, and shall cast it into the midst of the burning of the heifer" – *Numbers 19:6*

It was even used during the Crucifixion of our Messiah Yahshua!

"Then a vessel full of vinegar was set, and having filled a sponge with vinegar, and putting hyssop around, they brought it to His mouth" – *John 19:29*


Hyssop is part of the mint family, and has a warm bitter taste (*read Exodus 12:8*) and a sweet scent. The flowers and leaves are traditionally used in medicine, cooking, tea, extracting essential oils and fragrances and can even be used to make honey from the pollen.

Now, the Hebrew Word in the bible traditionally translated as Hyssop is Ezov, which is from an unknown origin and might be referring to a different herb, such as oregano or the caper bush.

Whatever the actual plant used in biblical times might be, it was indeed a very special and holy plant, because it's the only plant that was used with the blood of Messiah.





The Feast of Unleavened Bread

Exodus 13:6-7

The second feast that YAHWEH commands us to observe is the Feast of Unleavened Bread. This feast starts the day after Passover and it continues for seven days. YAHWEH tells us to remove <u>all</u> the leaven from our homes.



Leaven is anything used to make dough or batter rise. Such as, yeast, baking powder and baking soda. These ingredients can be found in many foods that we eat.


So, on the day portion of Passover; we search our kitchen and any other place in the home where food is kept and we throw away all food with these ingredients. In the Bible, leaven is often referred to as a type of sin.

Just like leaven puffs up, so does sin!

Unleavened Bread is flat bread that contains <u>no leavening agent</u>. This represents the absence of sin. YAHWEH commands us to eat unleavened bread during this feast time to symbolize the opposite of sin and it shows our active obedience to Him.


Why is the feast kept for 7 days? Well, the number seven is YAHWEH's special number that <u>means completion and perfection</u>. So, the seven days of the Feast of Unleavened Bread remind us that YAHWEH wants His people to strive to put sin completely out of their lives.

Upon repentance and baptism, **YAHSHUA's sacrifice blots out all of our past sins**. He died so we would not have to pay the penalty of death. After repentance and baptism, YAHWEH expects us to **obey His law** - to **"unleaven"** our lives.




What can we eat?

What is the Feast of First Fuit?

Leviticus 23:10-11

During the Feast of Unleavened Bread we have a very special and important day called *the feast of First Fruit*.

This day is always the first Sunday (first day of the week) after the weekly Sabbath during the feast of Unleavened Bread. It is the day that Yahshua was resurrected after being in the grave for three days and three nights after His Crucifixion. It is called the day of first fruits because **Yahshua was the first to be resurrected** from the dead into YAHWEH's Family. He went up into Heaven and He was **accepted by His Father**, and our Father, as the **first fruit** of all living.

This day also starts the 50 day count until Shavout or Pentecost, YAHWEH's third annual feast.


During the Feast of Unleavened Bread, on the night portion of the first day of the week, the people would cut a sheaf of new barley from their fields. They would grind it into flour in the amount of an **omer** and bring it to the priest.

So, what is an Omer?

It is a biblical unit of dry measurement about equal to two quarts!

The priest would wave it in the air to be accepted by YAHWEH as the first fruit of their physical harvest. Then the harvesting could begin. The people were not allowed to eat of their harvest until their first fruit offering was brought to the priests to be accepted before YAHWEH.

YAHSHUA fulfilled this by ascending to YAHWEH in Heaven and being accepted as the first fruit of the great spiritual harvest that was to come.




Crucifixion Crossword





At the Tomb

- Scissors
- Colored Pencils, Crayons or Markers
- Glue
- Piece of Cardboard, Same Size as Paper*
- Ribbon, String or Dental Floss
- Knife or sharp object to cut
 - *Cereal Box Works Great






Instructions:

- 1. Print, color and cutout the last page.
- 2. Color the first page and glue it on top of the cardboard.
- 3. Very carefully and with adult supervision, poke holes through gray dots. (Make sure you cut through the paper and the cardboard.)
- 4. Thread string through holes and tie a knot in the back.
- 5. Fold Rectangle cutout in half so it's in the form of a "V".
- 6. Glue one end of rectangle to the back of stone
- 7. Apply glue to other end of the rectangle and fold together with string inside. (See figure A)
- 8. Glue second page on top of the first page, aligning it correctly but make sure not to apply glue in the line of motion of the rock.
- 9. Move rock by pulling on the string.



- Scissors
- Colored Pencils, Crayons or Markers
- Glue
- **Optional:** Piece of Cardboard, Same Size as Paper




Instructions:

- 1. Print, color and cutout everything on the second page.
- Cut door off page 1 (save for later) and fold the page at the fold lines to make a cave. (See Figure A)
- 3. Glue "He is not Here" to either the front or back of the cave, so it can be seen through the door.
- 4. Cut out the last page and color it. (Optional: glue page to cardboard same size as paper)
- 5. Glue cave to last page where marked.
- 6. Cut up dotted lines on door, fold the flaps and glue to the last page near the cave. (Door not seen in example).
- Fold the rectangle boxes under the figures on page two and glue them on the last page in any order with the cave.
