Saint John Wick!

That headline got me to read about Saint Olga.

That heading was an introduction to Saint Olga.She was queen from 945 to 960, and she died in 969. Her capital city was Kiev. (There's a series of John Wick films, he's an effective killer - "I once saw him kill three men in a bar. With a pencil!")

Olga married Prince Igor I of Kyiv and their son was Svyatoslav. Igor was under the guardianship of Oleg. When Oleg died a local tribe stop paying tribute and gave it instead to a local war lord. Igor's larger army persuaded them to pay tribute but on his way home Igor wanted more. He went back with a small escort and was murdered. Maybe he was badly tortured before he was killed.

Now Olga was queen - her three-year-old son was too young to rule. That tribe sent a messenger to Olga proposing she marry her husband's murderer. Twenty negotiators boated to Kiev to pass on their king's message. They were told to return to their boat but come back the next day to be honoured. When they came back they were carried into the court inside in the boat, dropped into a trench dug the night before, and buried alive. Then she asked that 'their distinguished men'' be sent to Kiev so she could go to their Prince with due honour. She killed them too!

She sent another message to them, to prepare a feast so she could weep for her husband and hold a funeral for him. When they were all drunk, she had them killed, followed up by a general massacre. Then she went back to Kiev for her army. She besieged their city for a year, then negotiated a settlement which was a trick to burn the city. The inhabitants fled, were killed, enslaved, or were left behind to pay tribute.

Then she ruled effectively as queen. in the 950s she went to Constantinople and became a Christian, taking the name Helena. Her son wouldn't become a Christian, but stopped persecuting converts. Her grandson Vladimir adopted Christianity in 988. In 1547 the Russian Orthodox named her a saint. In the Catholic Church her feast day is 11 July.
