• **Reformed Worship is prescribed**: permits in worship only that which is commanded in Scripture by God

"This attention to biblical prescription usefully keeps us from promoting any activity that sounds practical, appears beautiful, smells wonderful, feels comfortable, or tastes vaguely theological, but that is not prescribed in the Bible"

Duty of Proper Worship (21.1)

The light of nature shows that there is a God, who hath lordship and sovereignty over all, is good, and doth good unto all, and is therefore to be feared, loved, praised, called upon, trusted in, and served, with all the heart, and with all the soul, and with all the might. But the acceptable way of worshipping the true God is instituted by Himself, and so limited by His own revealed will, that He may not be worshipped according to the imaginations and devices of men, or the suggestions of Satan, under any visible representation, or any other way not prescribed in the holy Scripture.

- What is Light of Nature? General Revelation
- We are created as worshippers: we cannot not worship
- Nature displays there is a God, He is worthy of all our worship

Duty of Proper Worship (21.1)

- Worship according to nature's light is always unacceptable
 - Eye-Pleasing
 - Merit-Seeking
 - Mediator-Inventing
- Nature tells us to worship, but we always do so incorrectly

Duty of Proper Worship (21.1)

• Acceptable Worship: God tells us what He desires

- Innovative Worship Unacceptable: This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men. (Matt. 15:8-9)
- Worship is Not Needed: The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything. (Acts 17:24-25)

Duty of Proper Worship (21.1)

- Acceptable Worship: God tells us what He desires
- False Worship is Sinful
- Temptation to false worship is pervasive

"Since God has told us *how* He is to be worshiped, then to worship Him any other way is *worse* than no worship at all!" - John Gerstner

Object of Worship (21.2)

Religious worship is to be given to God, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; and to Him alone; not to angels, saints, or any other creature: and since the fall, not without a Mediator; nor in the mediation of any other but of Christ alone.

Object of Worship (21.2)

• Religious Worship?

- **The Triune God is worthy of worship:** Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
 - Gerstner: "Any worship that is not triune and not mediate by Christ is repugnant to Him"
 - Christ alone is Mediator between God and Man
- Religious worship without a mediator?

Object of Worship (21.2) • Religious Worship: to God alone and not *to* or *through* mere creatures

- E.g. Mary, Angels, Saints, Mamaw, etc.
- Christ alone is sufficient
