<u>'</u>Trevor's Column'

Dear sisters and brothers,

Last week I gave a brief theological reflection in the light of the election of a new Federal Government, and suggested some prayer points for those who have been elected. Today I want to add some points for further reflection about our other responsibilities as God's people.

Mainline politics is currently on the nose in this country as epitomised by strong comments we heard from one of our fellow travellers preparing for a camel ride in the Northern Territory. He had a very low view of all politicians which was expressed very strongly, and seemed only intent to know how to vote while on holidays so he did not receive a fine! Of course narrowly speaking politics is the science of government, including developing specific policies to enshrine in legislation for social improvements or change after gaining power through our electoral processes. But more broadly speaking, 'politics' denotes the whole life of the city and the responsibilities of its citizens which are not just confined to voting because the focus is the whole of life in society and the art of living together in community.

According to Jesus, Christians have inescapable 'political' obligations (Mark 12:17), with the Apostle Paul emphasising we are not exempt from 'submission' to the governing authorities (Romans 13:1). 'Submission' however never means uncritical, unquestioning obedience, but rather recognising our God given responsibilities in a relationship. Apart from the fundamental requirement to pray, this will include a number of things in the political sphere. It will mean respect for our political leaders as servants of God who are accountable ultimately to him. For the sake of their office, it may mean even treating with full seriousness people who have little or no understanding of the dignity of their positions. Moreover when rulers act unworthily or commit injustice, respect will involve rebuke by those in a position to administer it. It will also mean *obedience* in so far as it does not involve disobeying God, and a serious and responsible *disobedience* whenever obedience would involve disobeying him (Acts 4:19), as with some recent social legislation in this country. It means *payment of taxes* for the protection and amenities provided, but also for the sake of the weak and powerless. If we love our neighbours as ourselves, we need to be careful not to be just guided by the personal benefits received, but will rather endorse making sacrifices for the common good and wellbeing of others. It will also mean ongoing witness to Christ in word and deed as we fulfil our God-given calling to be salt and light in his world.

This introduces but does not exhaust what could be written on this topic so I plan to add some more reflections next week

Rev 3:7-13

(Text for 8.30am & 11am)

"To the angel of the church in Philadelphia write:

These are the words of him who is holy and true, who holds the key of David. What he opens no one can shut, and what he shuts no one can open. ⁸ I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name. ⁹ I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan, who claim to be Jews though they are not, but are liars—I will make them come and fall down at your feet and acknowledge that I have loved you. ¹⁰ Since you have kept my command to endure patiently, I will also keep you from the hour of trial that is going to come on the whole world to test the inhabitants of the earth.

¹¹ I am coming soon. Hold on to what you have, so that no one will take your crown. ¹² The one who is victorious I will make a pillar in the temple of my God. Never again will they leave it. Rev 3:14-22

(Text for 10.30am & 5.30pm)

"To the angel of the church in Laodicea write:

These are the words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation. ¹⁵ I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! ¹⁶ So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth. ¹⁷ You say, 'I am rich; I have acquired wealth and do not need a thing.' But you do not realize that you are wretched, pitiful, poor, blind and naked. ¹⁸ I counsel you to buy from me gold refined in the fire, so you can become rich; and white clothes to wear, so you can cover your shameful nakedness; and salve to put on your eyes, so you can see.

¹⁹ Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent. ²⁰ Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.

²¹ To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I was victorious and sat down with my Father on his throne. ²² Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches."
