Night Meeting, Tuesday, June 8, 7-9 PM via Zoom Quilts4Kids, Nepal

Quilts4Kids is a non-profit organization based in Kathmandu, Nepal. Through the distribution of the quilts the women create, the foundation provides work for economically challenged women and educates at-risk children in South Asia. James Hopins, the founder, will join us via Zoom from Kathmandu. He will tell the fascinating story of how he started the foundation, explain how the women make their quilts, and answer any questions. There will be a slide show.

Also joining us via Zoom is Ravina Kaur. Ravina is one of the young women who has ben-



efitted from the program, and is a new graduate of Sweetbriar College. She'll share her experiences growing up in Nepal and going to college in the United States. I am so pleased that the Board has agreed to this presentation, as the cause is dear to my heart. I met James in Kathmandu in February, 2020, and spent an afternoon with him and the women in their camp. I was amazed at the stunning work they do with very few tools or sewing aids.
