Know God Better 5 Fellowship Acts 2: 42 +1 John 1: 1-7 15th November




What do you enjoy doing with other people? In normal times much of our lives are shared with family, friends and other people. We share with them in good times and in bad times, in times of joy and especially in times of sadness. The more time we spend with someone the better we understand them, the better we get to know them and the better we are able to support one another.

Today we are thinking about fellowship or sharing. The word used in the New Testament, koinonia, is variously translated as fellowship, sharing, partnership or communion. It is used both about sharing with other Christians and about sharing with God. Fellowship with God. knowing God better. is not something we do in isolation. It is done within the fellowship of the church. This sharing goes right back to the call of the first disciples, they left everything and followed Jesus and were constantly with him, they shared in his ministry, they got to know him and they learned from him. Because they got to know Jesus better they got to know God better through fellowship with Him.

At the start of the church, described in Acts 2:42, they devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and prayers. There was a sharing and commitment to one another. The sort of fellowship that the apostles had when Jesus was on earth continued into the life of the church. It continues in the church to this day. That fellowship was with one another but it was also with God through the presence of the Holy Spirit making Jesus real. In all we do together as a church we share in God's work and ministry just as that early church did.

In his first letter, John focusses on the need for Christians to love God and one another. Love comes when we share wholeheartedly in fellowship together. John wants more people to hear the word of life so that they might share in this fellowship. It is not just human fellowship, important as that is. It is fellowship with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. This is the distinctive element of Christian fellowship that sets it apart from any ordinary human fellowship. Through the Holy Spirit we know God's presence always with us and we share in Him. And in that sharing we get to know God better.

When we use the prayer we call "The Grace" and speak of the fellowship of the Holy Spirit being with us all, we are expressing our sharing together in Christ. We encourage one another in fellowship with God. Fellowship with God and fellowship with one another is right at the heart of knowing God better. In difficult times as well as good times let us go on sharing with one another so that we may know afresh God's love in our hearts and lives and live in fellowship with Him.
