Scott Settlement Rendezvous


The time period is pre-1840 America as people were moving into and through what is now Arkansas. As seen in the photo, people lived in conventional tents and some in lean-to shelters until they could build permanent homes. Join us in celebration of these times at Scott Settlement. In addition to settlement tours, the blacksmith shop will be open, demonstrations of firearms, cooking, trapping, and everyday living. The 40 foot keelboat "Aux Arc" will be on display. Plans are for a skillet and tomahawk throwing contest, rope pull, cooking contest, and horse races (sort of). Free Parking! There are tentative plans to have a presentation on the Trail of Tears, plus planned food and drinks on-site. Admission for the public is \$3. Attention: For historical reenactors camping is available, with firewood, water, and restrooms provided. Plans are for a potluck supper Saturday night, plus on Sunday, a rifle shoot is planned. The Settlement is not open to the public on Sunday. (I think they have also added a Moccasin class.)

Hwy 14 goes through Oil Trough, which is between Batesville and Jacksonport. From Searcy follow Hwy 167 north to Bald Knob and on to Pleasant Plains. 
