Our vocabulary words will be: swoop, clutch, escape, clamber, and curious. New sight words will go home today, as well as last week's work. Our letter this week will be /m/. 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**1st/2nd:** This week in 1st grade we are reading nonfiction stories about sea animals. Our two main stories are *Whales* by Laura Marsh and *Dolphins* by Melissa Stewart. We will be identifying how these mammals are alike and different. We are doing great on our sentence writing. We will be reviewing long vowel sounds this week, as well as verbs. We will also learn about and practice writing a letter in handwriting. In math we are continuing to work on addition and we are also learning to read and make bar graphs. In 2nd grade we will be reading the story *Crankenstein* by Samantha Berger. We will talk about how pictures can sometimes give us information when we are reading. In grammar we will be working on quotation marks and adjectives. In math we will continue working on fractions. We will also be working on place value. The students are doing great in cursive so far. We are learning how to make each letter. 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**3rd/4th:** Welcome back after the wonderful weekend we had. This week is Red Ribbon week which means students will be able to dress up according to the theme of the day. On Wednesday, the theme is class colors. Our class color this year is red. Since it is a short week, our weekly spelling test will be on Thursday. Students will have a Social Studies test on Wednesday over their notecards. Third grade will have a math test on Thursday. **5th/6th:** In Writing, 6<sup>th</sup> graders will be finishing their Patriot's Pen essays this week. In Science, 5<sup>th</sup> graders will read about groundwater and aquifers and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will start a new chapter on the 3 states of matter. In English, both grades will be looking at direct objects and past, present, and future tense. In Reading, students will be reading Ch. 4 in our Lit. Circle book "Bridge to Terabithia". In Social Studies, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will still be learning about the Revolutionary War and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 2. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will be starting a new Lit. Circle this week over "To Kill a Mockingbird" by Harper Lee. - Mrs. Foster

**5/6 Math:** As we begin the new quarter, fifth grade is working on different representations of fractions, operations with fractions, and demonstrating how to use protractors. In sixth grade, students are working on percent/fraction/decimal equivalencies, decimal numbers including place value and how to read them, and perfect-square roots. **Tests This Week:** 6th Math: Tuesday; 5th Math: Wednesday **7/8:** In social studies, seventh grade is finishing a study on Ancient Greece and will soon be taking a look at the Roman Empire. In eighth grade, students are looking at early efforts at westward expansion and the growing unrest between colonists and England.
