THE MINISTER'S MUSINGS...

Dear Friends,

We have now entered the season of Lent. This is the 40 days (excluding Sundays) that lead up to the celebration of Easter. (See the Lenten History Lesson)

On Ash Wednesday, we enjoyed our Annual Pancake Supper (with great thanks to Celia Broadhead!) Typically pancakes are eaten the day before on Shrove Tuesday. That is the day of the ancient tradition of ridding homes of all fats and meats until Easter. And what better way that to enjoy pancakes, sausage and bacon! Large festivals used to be held which included pancake races, determining who could eat the most pancakes, and the like.

At the Crestview church we do both the pancake supper and Ash Wednesday service on Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday is the day that officially begins the Lenten season. This season is a season of reflection and repentance. We are called upon to reflect upon our mistakes, shortcomings, and sins, and the role we have played that necessitated the crucifixion of Jesus.

During this season we the tone of the worship changes a bit. Following tradition, music is a bit more somber. The scriptures point toward the journey Jesus made to Jerusalem and the waiting arms of the cross. You will also notice the order of worship has changed a bit. A couple items have been added, a couple have been taken out, and a couple moved around. (Yes, change. Aarrgghh!)

The intention behind this is to help call attention to the fact that this season is different. It calls for us to pay closer attention to our lives. By changing the order of worship leading up to Easter Sunday, it is hoped we will all pay a little closer attention to our worship together and the message God is conveying to us.

Don't worry. The familiar will return in the near future, but hopefully with a bit more meaning because of the focus of Lent.

One last thing... Some people talk about giving up something for Lent as a way of making a personal sacrifice. Here is a suggestion. Instead of giving up something, add something... like praying for an enemy, helping someone in need, serving at the soup kitchen, calling those who would love to hear from you.



A Lenten History Lesson

Though the date of Easter varies, the majority of the Lenten season occurs during March. In fact, the word *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon words lenctentid (meaning "March") and lencten (meaning "spring").

The first reference to Lent dates back to 325 AD, in one of the 20 canons decreed at the council of Nicaea. By the eighth century, Christians started observing Lent, and a 10th-century monk named Aelfric connected the use of ashes and "the Lenten fast" to the pre-Easter period.

Lent lasts 40 days to represent Jesus' time in the wilderness, when he was tempted by the devil. The six Sundays that occur between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday aren't counted as part of Lent; instead, as the traditional day of worship, they're considered "mini-Easters."
